

Jessamine County Arrests and Citations

Staff Report

Lindsey Marie Bonds, of Nicholasville, was arrested Feb. 6 on the Nicholasville Bypass and charged with operating a motor vehicle under the influence of a controlled substance. According to police, Bonds showed signs of impairment during field sobriety testing, including lack of smooth pursuit and balance issues. Officers reported locating prescription methadone inside the vehicle. A blood sample was collected following the arrest. Court records indicate the offense marked her second DUI within a 10-year period.

Trevor Allan Pinkston, of Lexington, was arrested late Feb. 6 and into the early morning hours of Feb. 7 following a traffic stop on Grey Oak Lane and East Brannon Road. Pinkston was charged with operating a motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol, fourth offense, and disregarding a

stop sign. Police reported a strong odor of alcohol and glassy eyes. A breath test later recorded a blood alcohol concentration of .220. Court records indicate multiple prior DUI offenses within a 10-year period.

Travis L. Watts, of Lexington, was arrested Feb. 6 following a traffic stop on Wilmore Road. Watts was charged with wanton endangerment, first degree; fleeing or evading police, first degree (motor vehicle); resisting arrest; reckless driving; operating a motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol or drugs; operating on a suspended or revoked license; and failure to maintain required insurance. Police reported the vehicle failed to stop for officers, crossed into oncoming traffic and continued driving despite emergency lights and sirens.

Gerald A. Taylor, of Lexington, was arrested Feb. 7 after officers responded to a report of a vehicle in a ditch

on South Main Street. Taylor was charged with operating a motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol, first offense; operating on a suspended or revoked license; and reckless driving. Police reported signs of impairment during field sobriety testing. A breath test later recorded a blood alcohol concentration of .191.

Kaitlyn Alexandra Carpenter, of Lexington, was arrested Feb. 8 on Grey Oak Lane and charged with operating a motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol, first offense; failure to obey a stop sign; and possession of an open alcoholic beverage container in a motor vehicle. Police reported Carpenter failed to stop at a stop sign and did not use a turn signal. Officers noted signs of impairment, including red, glassy eyes and the odor of alcohol. A breath test later recorded a blood alcohol concentration of .152. An

open bottle of Fireball whiskey was reportedly located inside the vehicle.

Adonis Patino, of Nicholasville, was arrested Feb. 7 at a residence on Faulconer Drive and charged with first-degree strangulation and fourth-degree assault (domestic violence-related). According to police, the incident involved a physical altercation between Patino and his sister. Police reported the victim stated Patino placed his hands around her neck, restricting her breathing, and struck her multiple times. Officers reported visible redness and bruising on the victim's neck. Patino denied the allegations and was lodged in the Jessamine County Detention Center. Body-worn camera footage was activated during the incident.

Jacqueline M. Wright, of Richmond, was arrested Feb. 7 on North Main Street and charged with theft by unlawful taking

(shoplifting). Police reported Wright passed the point of sale at Walmart without paying for merchandise valued at \$118.16 while concealing some items. She was also criminally trespassed from the store.

Edgar Oliveras, of Nicholasville, was arrested Feb. 7 on a Jessamine County District Court bench warrant for failure to appear. Police reported the warrant stemmed from a prior case. No additional details were provided in the citation.

Whitney Thompson, of Berea, was arrested Feb. 8 on the Nicholasville Bypass and charged with no registration plates and driving on a DUI-suspended license, first offense. Police reported the vehicle's registration had expired and dispatch confirmed Thompson's license was suspended due to a prior DUI.

Kyle D. Bishop, of Nicholasville, was arrested Feb. 9 on Lexington Road

and charged with operating a motor vehicle on a suspended or revoked license and disregarding a traffic control device. Police reported Bishop failed to yield at a traffic signal and was found to be driving while suspended.

Richard Brewer, of Nicholasville, was arrested Feb. 9 at Virginia Lane and Faulconer Drive and charged with first-degree possession of a controlled substance, methamphetamine, third or subsequent offense. Police reported responding to a call of a suspicious person and later located suspected methamphetamine during a search of Brewer's vehicle and wallet. The substance was reportedly found in a plastic bindle and inside a folded dollar bill.

All charges are allegations. Defendants are presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.

Attorney general clarifies law for Kentucky sportsmen

FRANKFORT — Attorney General Russell Coleman announced Thursday that Kentuckians who own farmland in the Commonwealth are eligible for a fishing and hunting license exemption, even if they don't live on the farmland. In a formal Opinion of the Attorney General, General Coleman overruled

decades-old interpretations of the statute that limited the license exemption only to those who currently resided on the land.

Kentucky State Senator Gary Boswell (R-Owensboro) requested the Opinion of the Attorney General. As part of the legal review, the Attorney General's Office consulted the Kentucky Department of Fish and

Wildlife Resources, which has historically "applied a lenient interpretation" to the statute.

"As someone who grew up hunting with my dad on his Logan County farm, I'm proud to stand up for the rights of all sportsmen," said Attorney General Coleman. "Kentucky is home to some of the finest natural and wildlife resources in the world, and I encourage

every Kentuckian to responsibly enjoy them while supporting critical conservation and preservation efforts."

The Office of the Attorney General is tasked with providing legal opinions to public officials to assist them in the performance of their duties. Opinions of the Office are persuasive in Kentucky courts and public officials are expected to

follow them.

"I'm particularly grateful for the whip-smart attorneys in our Office who diligently considered this complex legal history to uphold the law and for Kentucky's outdoorsmen."

Kentuckians are well-served by Aaron Silletto, Chris Bowlin and Christopher Thacker in the AG's Office, Attorney General Coleman continued.

Following the publication of the formal Opinion of the Attorney General, the Office notified Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources Commission Chair Chuck Meade that it would close the matter involving his eligibility to serve.
