

Pursuant to Application Number 090-9402, Amendment 3

(1) In accordance with 405 KAR 5:032, Section 21, notice is hereby given that Haydon Materials Bardstown, LLC, 625 Airport Rd, Bardstown, KY 40004, intends to apply for an amendment to its non-coal surface mining permit for limestone affecting 158.1 additional acres for a total of 316.1 acres located approximately 4.3 miles west of Bardstown, in Nelson County, Kentucky.

(2) The proposed operation is located along Airport Road approximately 0.77 miles northwest of Cravens, Kentucky. The latitude is 37°49'07". The longitude is -85°32'26".
