Michael Eugene Quigley, 84

Michael Eugene Quigley entered into eternal life on May 14, 2026. He was born in Manchester, England on Sept. 28, 1941, to the late Ellen and Eugene Quigley.

As a wartime infant, he and his parents survived the blitz bombing of WW II. Subsequently, he remained in Manchester for the first 20 years of his life, building a foundation in academics, attending Catholic high schools, and achieving his first degree at London University. He continued to study at Lancaster University, where he completed a Master's degree in Phenomenology and Philosophy. He continued his academic career teaching Religion and Philosophy at Manchester University. Michael was then awarded a scholarship to study for a MA degree in New York, followed by a fellowship to complete a PhD degree at Boston College in Theology and Philosophy. While doing so, he taught undergraduates at Manhattan and Boston College. During this time he also became a proud United States citizen.

For the next 22 years Michael served as a Dean of the Graduate School at River University in Nashua, N.H. At the same time he continued to teach Philosophy and Ethics in the graduate Business and Education pro-



grams. In 1983, he pioneered a program in Quality Management in both Business and Education Departments under the direction of Dr. W. Edwards Deming, the founder of the new worldwide management philosophy. It became a program which the principles of new management were developed in accordance with Catholic Social Teaching.

In 1998, Michael was invited to become Director of the International Trade at Brevard College near Asheville, N.C.; which was founded specifically to introduce Russian university students to the philosophy and principles of new management. This program resulted in his traveling to Russia more than 20 times and teaching 500 Russian students. It also brought him in contact with numerous members of the Russian Orthodox Church, enabling him to

establish an extraordinary dialogue between Catholic and Orthodox theology.

Finally, after teaching over 50 years, he and his wife Jeanette returned to Bardstown, KY, in 2010 where he continued to teach where invited.

He is survived by his devoted and loving wife, Jeanette of 53 years, and his only sibling, Fr. Gerard Quigley, Bury St. Edmonds, England.

A Mass of Christian burial will be 11 a.m. Wednesday, May 20, at the Basilica of St. Joseph Proto-Cathedral, Fr. Matthew Hardesty, celebrant. Interment will be in St. Vincent de Paul Church Cemetery in New Hope.

say," Hutchins said. "I bring people and organizations together in our community — I am not a community disrupter."

Thrasher, on the other hand, relies his role as one who bucks the status quo.

"County government should be run with the same standards as a well-managed business: clear expectations, strict accountability, and measurable results," Thrasher said. "Policies should be enforced consistently, financial controls should be non-negotiable, and every dollar spent should be justified."
