“He bogeyed four holes in a row on the front and was 6 over at the turn,” Osborne said. “He could play that course 20 times and he might shoot 79 once in 20 times. It just happened to be the day.”

Greenwell did play much better on the inward nine with a 36.

Sophomore Miller Osborne struck the ball well but a triple bogey on the 14th hole stopped his momentum. He finished with a 77.

“The good thing is he got his confidence back,” his dad said. “He hit the ball really well today.”

The good news for Bethlehem is that the team will enter play in the first round of the state tournament on their home course at Maywood. Play gets underway on Tuesday.

“The region was just like the NCAA Tournament where people don’t care how much you win by,” Osborne said. “You just want to survive and advance. We’ve beaten every team that’s going to be at (the) first round of state. We’ve beaten them multiple times this year but that doesn’t mean we’re going to beat them on Tuesday.”

The top three teams plus the low 15 individuals not on a winning team will move on to the final two rounds in Bowling Green. They will be played October 6-7 at Bowling Green

NOTICE OF PROPOSED GENERAL FUND TAX RATE
Nelson County Board of Education

The Nelson County Board of Education proposes to reduce the general tax rate from 67.0 cents to 66.2 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation on real property and personal property for the current year.

General Tax Rate Proposal for Current Year: 66.2 cents per \$100
Prior Year Revenue: \$34,791,744.58

New Revenue Breakdown
General Fund (Instruction & Operations): \$1,249,483.17
Facility Fund (Mandated by KRS): \$1,037,979.85
Total Revenue (Combined from General & Facility): \$2,287,463.02
*The numbers above do not take into account loss in state funding and should not be viewed as the district's net revenue impact.

New General Fund Revenue Use
The proposed rate is expected to generate more revenue than received in the preceding year. The additional revenue will be used in the following general areas:
1. Teacher and staff compensation increases in alignment with inflation.
2. Increased costs associated with insurance, student transportation, fuel, and bus purchasing.
3. Filling gaps in funding from state and federal programs including student transportation, special education, and student health services.
4. Increased tax collection costs.

Compensating Rate and Other Required Information
The compensating general tax rate is 63.3 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation, which would produce \$35,454,891.85 in revenue.

Of the revenue expected from the proposed rate, \$12,476,173.70 is expected from new property and personal property. Personal property includes distilled spirits revenue.
