Early Notice and Public Review of a Proposed Activity in a 100-Year Floodplain

To: All interested Agencies, including the Federal Emergency Management Agency, Kentucky Department for Environmental Protection, and City of Central City, Groups and Individuals

This is to give notice that the City of Central City, Kentucky, has determined that the following proposed action under a Community Development Block Grant is located in the 100-year floodplain, and the City of Central City will be identifying and evaluating practicable alternatives to locating the action in the floodplain and the potential impacts on the floodplain from the proposed action, as required by Executive Order 11988 and/or 11990, in accordance with HUD regulations at 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management and Protection of Wetlands.

The Central City Lift Station Rehabilitation Project involves the rehabilitation of 10 wastewater lift stations within the Central City Wastewater System that are aging and in need of repair. Lift station sites in the scope of the project include: Green River Correctional Complex; Hendrix; Divine; Housing Authority #1; Harrison; Kirtley; Rolling Acres; Highway 70; Greenleaf; and Bremen. The Green River Correctional Complex lift station is located in a 0.2 percent annual chance flood hazard area as illustrated in the Flood Insurance Rate Map for Muhlenberg County Unincorporated Areas, Panel 21177C0153C, effective October 16, 2013. Approximately 0.21 acres in the project area are located within this floodplain. The proposed project is located

at 1200 River Road, Central City, Muhlenberg County, Kentucky (GPS coordinates -87.11165, 37.31573).

There are three primary purposes for this notice. First, people who may be affected by activities in floodplains and those who have an interest in the protection of the natural environment should be given an opportunity to express their concerns and provide information about these areas. Commenters are encouraged to offer alternative sites outside of the floodplain, alternative methods to serve the same project purpose, and methods to minimize and mitigate impacts. Second, an adequate public notice program can be an important public educational tool. The dissemination of information and request for public comment about floodplains can facilitate and enhance Federal efforts to reduce the risks and impacts associated with the occupancy and modification of these special areas. Third, as a matter of fairness, when the Federal government determines it will participate in actions taking place in floodplains, it must inform those who may be put at greater or continued risk. Written comments must be received by the City of Central City in care of the Pennyriple Area Development District at the following address on or before March 25, 2026: Pennyriple Area Development District, 300 Hammond Drive, Hopkinsville, KY, 42240, telephone 270-886-9484, Attention: Jared Nelson, Projects Coordinator.
