- Public record must be in good standing with no felony convictions
 - Adherence with FBI drug policy
 - Pass urinalysis and background investigation
 - Student loan repayments must be in good standing
 - Filed all required annual federal, state, and local taxes
 - Current on court ordered child payments
 - No engagement with organizations designed to overthrow the U.S. government
 - Register with the Selective Service System (for male applicants only, exceptions apply)
