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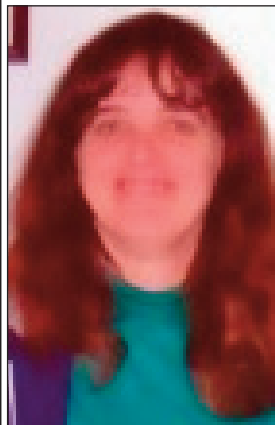

The 2026 Lewis County Property Tax Bills are due and payable at the Lewis County Sheriff's Office beginning Thursday, October 1, 2026.

If mailing your payment, please include a copy of your tax bill or write the tax bill number/map number on your check. If you want a paid receipt returned to you, please enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope with your payment.

If you do not receive a tax bill by October 15, 2026, visit the website to obtain a copy or contact the Lewis County Sheriff's office at 606-796-2912.

### COLLECTION SCHEDULE

**2% Discount – October 1, 2026 through November 1, 2026**  
**Face Amount – November 2, 2026 through December 31, 2026**  
**5% Penalty – January 1, 2027 through January 31, 2027**  
**21% Penalty – February 1, 2027 through April 15, 2027**

**Note:** The General Assembly passed House Bill 262, which transfers the responsibility of advertising and selling delinquent property tax bills from the Lewis County Sheriff to the Lewis County Clerk. Delinquent tax bills will be transferred to Lewis County Clerk Leslie Collier at the close of business on April 15, 2027. In addition to the penalties and fees that are applied by the Sheriff's Office, payments made in the Lewis County Clerk's Office are also subject to penalties and fees. The delinquent tax bills are subject to being sold to a Third Party in the summer of 2027.
