even the most-experienced members of Racer Nation could not have foreseen. It started with rather hidden projects (indoor golf, baseball/softball facilities at Roy Stewart Stadium) and has morphed to include projects that are now making the league that Murray State was entering in Sep-tember 2022 — the Mis-souri Valley Conference, one of the top mid-major leagues in all of collegiate athletics — do double takes.

Johnny Reagan Field at Taylor Family Park is in the process of a major facelift, coinciding with the Racers’ stunning 2025 run to the College World Series in Omaha. Football’s Rudolph Family Field at Roy Stewart Stadium and softball’s Racer Field are undergo-ing similar changes and an eventual entertainment village will someday trans-form the northeast edge of the campus borders.

That comes back to the CFSB Center, which will soon return to having Dill Family Court (removed for the construction, along with all of the banners in the upper rafters, for their protection). It also has been designed to be a meaner, nastier arena for visiting teams after its original de-sign left all four corners near the court empty, al-lowing noise to not radi-

ate entirely to the court. Visitors Tuesday noticed the enclosed corners, part of the first-ever permanent seating for the arena.

“When I first arrived here as president, I heard a lot of sentiments about Racer Arena and how the crowd had been right on top of the opposing team,” said Murray State Presi-dent Dr. Ron Patterson of the newly-configured de-sign. “So when Nico and I, along with (facilities man-ager) Brock Rydecki start-ed (discussing The Bank’s renovation) with our team, we focused on kind of re-creating the energy of Rac-er Arena (much smaller in size, though much more noisy) to the CFSB Center. How do we bring that right onto the opposing team? We think we’ve done that well.

“It’s going to be loud.” He said seeing the beam rise from a podium on its way to the student section behind the northwest end zone was something he will never forget.

“Seriously ... I felt the floor moving underneath my feet,” he said.

It was easy to tell that Tuesday’s ceremony was a big deal because the “Com-mish” came from more than three hours to witness it. Valley Commissioner Jeff Jackson does not at-tend ordinary events for the schools he represents, so his attendance sent a mes-sage.

He immediately, though,

deflected his presence as being important.

“What’s a big deal is what you guys are doing here!” said Jackson, who was in Murray back in May to see Reagan Field host the Valley Baseball Championship for the first time and attract some of the biggest crowds ever seen at that facility. He said he also made a visit to The Bank earlier this summer to view the construction.

“This has evolved more than when I saw it a couple of months ago,” said Jack-son, a former college bas-ketball player and coach, obviously anticipating a

return to see the finished product. “I can’t wait to get back here and see a game.”

Jackson also said Tues-day’s event was a first for him.

“No! I’ve never seen anything like that (relat-ed to an athletics project). That was alright! Pretty cool,” he said.

Ultimately, the main tenants of the building, the Racer men’s and women’s basketball teams, will ulti-mately decide the amount of success for this project. They will be the ones seek-ing to take the most advan-tage of what is expected to be a more hostile environ-

ment to their opponents.

“They’ve given us the resources. They’ve given us a beautiful facility. Now, we have to honor that with our play,” said Men’s Head Coach Ryan Miller, whose team had its best season since entering The Valley last year, finishing fourth and with 20 wins for the first time since Matt Mc-Mahon guided the Racers to the NCAA Tournament in 2022.

His women’s coun-terpart, Rechelle Turner, whose program has won two straight Valley titles, said she believes the re-novation of The Bank, as well

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
