Pursuant to KRS 132.027, the City of Murray, Kentucky will hold a public hearing on October 8, at 6:00 p.m. CST/7:00 p.m. EST in the Council Chambers, City Hall Building, 500 Main Street, Murray, Kentucky, at the regularly scheduled council meeting to hear comments from the public regarding proposed 2026 tax rates on real and tangible property. Individuals desiring to comment and requiring special accommodations may request same by contacting the City Clerk's Office located in City Hall, (270) 762-0300.

As required by state law, this notice includes the following information:

The City of Murray's proposed real property tax rate of \$0.2944 is a reduction of \$0.0167 from the 2025 rate. Tax revenue shall be deposited in the general fund to be spent by offsetting costs including but not limited to Public Safety, Public Works, and general administration of City government. Revenue generated exceeding the prior year will be utilized to meet increased costs in staffing, benefits, fuel, and project related expenses such as equipment and supplies. Additional funds will be utilized for street paving and park upgrades.

16 fraternity members, he said.

The building had a long history before it became a fraternity house. Suiter said it had been used as a boarding house, with professors from Murray State among those who rented rooms there. Calhoun said the property was owned by Oren and Mary Clark Hull, and Mary's parents started the Carman Hotel, which also used to be on the property. MSU's Lambda Chi Alpha chapter purchased the house from Mary Clark Hull in 1970 and took eight years to pay for it, Suiter said. The debt was retired in 1978.

Suiter, who was an undergraduate and graduate student at Murray State from 1975 to 1981, lived in the house during that period. The house included seven rooms, as well as an upstairs multi-room apartment that fraternity members called the "pent-house."

Several Lambda Chi Alpha alumni stood on the lawn Wednesday morning watching as the house was razed, and they said the house will always remind them of the experience of living away from home for the first time. Cliff Higginson, who lived in the house about 50 years ago, said he formed many lifelong friendships there.

"You're on your own for the first time, you're up there with friends and kind of making your way," Higginson said. "I have a lot

of good memories of the camaraderie we had when we were all here."

Watching alongside Higginson were Doug Brooks, Tom Russell and Scott Mitchell, vice president of the LCAHC. Mitchell said he fondly remembers the spontaneous gatherings that were common when he lived there as a student, and he and his fraternity brothers often played basketball out back.

"There was always somebody here and the opportunity to do something spur-of-the-moment," Mitchell said. "I lived here for three years in the '70s and loved every minute."

Mitchell said the fraternity began its latest fundraising effort after members of the LCAHC

determined that enough alumni were in a position to contribute to a major project. The campaign attracted both large and small contributions, he said. He said the demolition was bittersweet for alumni, but the new facility will give the fraternity a functional gathering place.

"It's been an eyecore for Murray, and they're trying to beautify (Main Street)," Mitchell said. "It was time, and we are very fortunate to have a lot of brothers who stepped up to the plate, and we're going to get this done. It's going to be something the fraternity, the university and the city can be proud of."

The demolition also carried a personal significance for Gingles, whose company performed the

work. He said his grandmother – May Boaz Simmons, or "Boazie" to those who knew her – grew up in the house, and even after his family no longer owned it, he was always aware of it when he was a child.

"Like I told Phil this morning, I'm excited, but a little down because I also was raised here in Murray," Gingles said. "I can remember when the parade came all the way down past here, and this was where we would always sit, right in front of the house. So it's just not tearing any old structure down for me. You hate to see it go, but at the same time, it's definitely for the best because it's gotten to be a hazard for sure."

The Lambda Chi Alpha national social fraternity recently purchased a new home at 1505 W. Main St. The new layout includes the house and former Carman Motel, directly across from Oakhurst, the president's residence.

Purchased June 6, 1970,
