INSPECTION PERIOD FOR THE PROPERTY ASSESSMENT ROLL

The Carroll County real property assessment roll will be open for inspection from May 4th through May 18th, 2026. Any person may inspect the assessment roll under the supervision of the Property Valuation Administrator or one of the deputies.

This is the January 1, 2026 assessment on which state, county, school, library, health, extension service, Ghent Fire District and local cities (where applicable) taxes for 2026 will be due about October 1, 2026.

The assessment roll is in the office of the Property Valuation Administrator in the Carroll County Courthouse and may be inspected between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday and on Saturdays during the inspection period.

Any taxpayer desiring to appeal an assessment on real property made by the PVA must first request a conference with the PVA. The conference may be held prior to or during the inspection period.

Any property owner still aggrieved by an assessment on real property, after the conference with the PVA, may appeal to the County Board of Assessment Appeals.

Property owners can appeal their assessment by filing in person or sending a letter or other written petition stating the reasons for appeal, identifying the property, and stating the property owner's opinion of the fair cash value of the property.

The appeal must be filed with the County Clerk's office no later than one workday following the conclusion of the inspection period.

Any property owner failing to appeal to the County Board of Assessment Appeals, or failing to appear before the board, either in person or by a designated representative, will not be eligible to appeal directly to the Kentucky Board of Tax Appeals.

Appeals of personal property assessments shall not be made to the County Board of Assessment Appeals. Personal property owners shall be served notice under the provisions of KRS 132.450(4) and shall have the protest and appeal rights granted under the provisions of KRS 131.110.

The following steps should be taken when a property owner does not agree with the assessed value of personal property: (1) They must list under protest (for certification) what they believe to be the fair cash value of their property. (2) They must file a written protest directly with the Department of Revenue, Office of Property Valuation within 30 days from the date of the notice of assessment. (3) This protest must be in accordance with KRS 131.110. (4) The final decision of the Department of Revenue may be appealed to the Kentucky Board of Tax Appeals.
