To be able to live stream or not that is the question

Can a couple of parents live stream Corbin High School football games for free?

This is a question parents Drew Mahan and Jerry Engle put to the Corbin Independent Board of Education during a special called meeting on Sept. 3.

Mahan told the board the pair had been live streaming various Corbin Independent School District events for some time.

Mahan has two sons, who graduated Corbin High School, and has another, who is a senior. Engle has two children at Corbin High School. One is a senior and the other is a sophomore.

"Jerry and I were asked to cover the baseball games and live stream those on Facebook," Mahan said. "We did that next to another media operation and they had zero issues with that. As a matter of fact, they celebrated with us."

The pair have also broadcast volleyball and highlighted the JROTC, golf, band and the academic team.

"Jerry and I, our only goal is to serve the community," Mahan said.

"While we don't have the biggest following and while we are not professionals, we have a growing group of people that watch us and thank us," Mahan said. "When we broadcast, it is live streamed and it is free. That has ruffled the feathers of some other folks, who have historically maybe had the rights to broadcast the ballgames."

Mahan said the pair walked into a Corbin football game late last month and were told they would be kicked out if they live streamed the game. Because of this, they only live streamed the scoreboard. They did not say, who told them this.

"If we know the rules, we will play by the rules. We are not here to cause any trouble," Mahan said. "However, we also went by KHSAA's (Kentucky High School Athletic Association) standards. If there is no express written contract that tells us, we cannot show – It is our own personal Facebook – it gets into the First

Amendment as well."

Mahan asked if the Corbin School District or Corbin High School would ask them to leave or ban them from live streaming the football games so his 80 something year old grandmother can watch it. She cannot come to the football games.

Mahan asked if the school district was going to stay out of the issue, or if the district was going to tell them they cannot do what they have been doing.

"We do not want to break the rules," Mahan said. "We are only here to celebrate the Redhound Way."

Mahan noted he and Engle have spent approximately \$2,000 on equipment to live stream the games.

Superintendent Travis Wilder said he had spoken with board attorney Bob Hammons, who said if there is an issue, then it needs to be taken up with the other entity they are talking about.

No one identified the other entity during the meeting.
