There were also the issues of slowing down Fall.

"She made a few shots early in the paint and they kept going to her," Troutman said. "We could not stop her."

The Lady Cougars got 16 points from Bickett and 11 from sophomore Chloe Hurst. All 45 of the Bullitt Central points came from the five starters.

Bullitt Central's season ended with a 15-14 record. That is five more wins than the team had in a difficult season a year ago. For the turnaround, Troutman was named the Kentucky Association of Basketball Coaches (KABC) Sixth Region Coach of the Year.

With six of seven players in the main rotation returning next season, the program is on a solid foundation. Troutman told her players that even after the tough setback.

"That's what I told them, that we had a great season," she said. "We did a lot of good things. The way we bounce back from the late losses will say a lot about their character."

For much of this season, the

offense for Bullitt East has often been dominated by seniors Anna Tinelli and Mollie Johnston. In fact, Johnston had scored 36 points in a recent game, a win over Franklin County on the road when she hit six straight three-pointers.

However, when the team needed balance in a big game, the Lady Chargers got that on Monday as the red and gold had six players score nine points or more as they held off a stubborn Moore team 75-68 in the semifinals of the 23rd District Tournament at Bullitt Central.

Bullitt East had a 58-48 lead heading into the fourth quarter before the Lady Mustangs scored the first six points of the final frame. The Lady Chargers finally scored when 8th-grader Charley Petrowski fed Tessa Parker under the basket for two points before Petrowski scored herself with six minutes remaining. Moore scored the next five points before Petrowski hit a free throw. At the midway mark of the quarter, Bullitt East's Lyla Packer went under the basket and hit a reverse layup to push the lead to 65-59.

Still, Moore kept the heat on with back-to-back baskets from freshmen Saryah Todd and 8th-grader Nacara Lewis to pull within 65-63 with three minutes to play. Johnston kept Bullitt East ahead only to have Asia Bowns-Jackson score for the Lady Mustangs.

However, that was as close as Moore would get. Bullitt East answered with the next six points on baskets from Maddie Sturgeon and Packer before Petrowski hit two free throws with 38 seconds remaining. Todd did get a late three-pointer, but two free throws by Tinelli accounted for the final score. "I've been telling our kids all year long that we can score

in various ways," veteran Bullitt East head coach Chris Stallings said. "Of the teams left in the tournament, we have a strong inside game and we had the perimeter game tonight to score points. I felt that down the stretch (of the season) that we were playing well offensively. "Tonight, it was good to see," the coach said of the balanced scoring. "We needed it. We needed every point. Certainly, they pose problems for us to guard."

Packer, the tallest player on the court, only had one point in the first half of this game, but she scored eight points in the second half while blocking three shots and claiming key rebounds.

Bullitt East had seven three-pointers in this game with six of those coming in the first half including three by Parker. Moore had nine three-pointers with four of those by Todd who had two in the fourth quarter when she scored 10 points.

Tinelli led Bullitt East with 16 points while Parker and Sturgeon each had 13. Sturgeon did not play in the last three games of the regular season with a wrist injury but the team found a way to tape the wrist that gave her mobility.

Todd paced a very young Moore team with 22 points.
