

# Eagles end season with big win over Evangel

SHEPHERDSVILLE – There was a lot of basketball played over the final week of the regular season as coaches added contests at the last minute after missing out on a week of games in early February due to snow.

The most impressive of those games for the local teams was the very last game as North Bullitt added a game against former 23rd District rival Evangel, a team that had already won 20 games and was ranked third in the Sixth Region before heavy favorites Butler and Jeffersontown.

The Eagles shot 52.4 percent from the field in the game and pulled out a 56-51 victory, giving North Bullitt 20 wins for the season.

The Boys 23rd District Tournament started on Sunday with Bullitt Central defeating Southern and advancing to play North Bullitt in the tournament semifinals on Tuesday. Bullitt East was going to play Moore in the other semifinal.

(Because of the newspaper's

deadlines, only the Bullitt Central game from Sunday is covered completely. The games from Tuesday night will be online on Wednesday morning and will be in next week's print edition.)

The Boys' 23rd District championship game is set for 7 p.m. on Thursday at Bullitt Central. The story on that game will be online the next morning and will also be in next week's print edition on Thursday.

The draws for the Boys' and Girls' Sixth Region Tournaments will be conducted on Saturday morning. The girls' tournament will start on Monday with games at the four teams that won district titles. The tournament will then shift to Atherton High School for the semifinals and final later in the week.

The Boys' event will start on Tuesday with four games at the sites of the four district champions. The Sixth Region tournament will then end early the following week at Atherton.

### SUMMARY

SECTION ONE: Sets forth that the right of way described in and on the attached Exhibits, which are incorporated into this ordinance by reference as if fully set forth herein, is hereby closed due to the consent of the adjoining landowners and the determination by the City Council that the right of way serves no purpose.

SECTION TWO: Sets forth the City Council's findings of facts in support of its determination to close the right-of-way.

SECTION THREE: Sets forth the severability clause.

SECTION FOUR: Sets forth the repeal of prior ordinances in conflict with this ordinance.
