championships, but she has run a 2:15 this season, a new school record. The top qualifying time for this race in Lexington was a 2:11.57 by Assumption senior Mabel George. However, the second-best seed had a regional time of 2:17.89. This will be Mooney's third race on Saturday and she will still have another that day.

Girls' 200-meter Dash – Like Mooney, Hannah Sutherland has qualified for four events at the state meet. She finished fourth in this race in the regional with a time of 26.12 while the winning time was 24.59.

Sutherland will be in the first of three heats on Saturday.

Boys' 200-meter Dash – North Bullitt's Micah Hoke must have decided that he wanted a gold, silver and bronze medal from the regional as he finished second in this event with a time of 22.38. The winning time was a 22.04 by Manual's Kaden Mack.

North Bullitt's Kevin Doe finished seventh in a time of 23.19 while Bullitt Central's Carter Still was 11th in 23.63. Bullitt East sophomore Jack Pope was 15th in 24.27 while junior teammate Owen Mueller was one spot back in 24.36. Bullitt Central sophomore Samual McCubbins was 21st in a time of 26.65.

Hoke will be seeded 16th for this event on Saturday and so will run in the middle of the three heats. The top time is 21.54. The 24 runners in this race are separated by 1.1 seconds.

Girls' 3,200-meter Run – Bullitt County had three runners in this race and all three earned team points as only six girls ran in the race.

North Bullitt senior Claire Wilson finished fourth in a time of 13:51.96. Bullitt East junior Payton Dennison was fifth in 13:54.02 while sophomore teammate Taylor Gumm was sixth in 14:43.94.

Boys' 3,200-meter Run – Bullitt Central got two points from junior Grayson King in this race as he finished fifth in a time of 10:26.51. The winning time was 9:39.14 by Male's Henry Kiser. North Bullitt sophomore Dylan Schott was eighth in 10:45.00 while senior teammate Jeremiah Lipkin was tenth in a time of 11:57.62.

Girls' 1,600-meter Relay – After each of the four team members had already competed in at least two earlier events, the four members of the Bullitt East put their best foot forward and won this race, turning back a Manual team by two seconds. The Lady Charger team of Haley Recktenwald, Savannah and Caroline Mooney and Hannah Sutherland posted a time of 4:12.63 to beat Manual's time of 4:14.71.

The North Bullitt team of junior Ava Parker, sophomore Sophia Irizarry and freshmen Evie Kardols and Ava Thompson was fourth in a time of 4:49.61.

Bullitt East will be seeded 15th for this event. The top time was turned in by Assumption with a time of 3:58.81.

Boys' 1,600-meter Relay – The only Bullitt County entry in this event was North Bullitt and head coach Dennis Mennis sent a young team of four freshman to the starting line. The group of Adam Sudiswa, Kebba

'ace', but then they served the ball into the net and with the next point, the match was tied at 11-11. North Bullitt had a service error, but then won the next two points, forcing DeSales to call its second time-out at 13-12.

The Colts got the point coming out of the time-out, but then served the ball into the net, giving North Bullitt its first match point. However, North Bullitt could not take quick advantage. While the team never faced a match point, they needed four match points before securing the win. The match was tied past 15 at 17-17 before DeSales had their fourth service error of the game. This time the Eagles seized the opportunity, winning the next point to secure the 19-17 victory.

In the post-season, the first question to Floyd had become the same, "what took so long?" for the Eagles to shift into a higher gear.

"Tonight it was a little different combination of things," the assistant coach said. "It was a little bit of nerves and excitement.

"We have always started slow," Floyd continued. "Today the story was the nerves and excitement would be fair to say.

North Bullitt had reached the 16-team state tournament a year earlier, but had lost in the first-round to Holy Cross, a team that would fall to DeSales in the next round. That first state tournament game a year ago had been at home. That was the same thing this season as after winning the Fourth Region title over Fern Creek, the

Eagles had hosted Casey County. The DeSales match was the first post-season contest for the Eagles on the road.

"I could tell how focused they were," Floyd said of the pre-game preparation. "They were all focused. They wanted to be calm and cool. This is a big stage. Most of them have never been in this environment. It was a great win for the program."

The win moved the Eagles into the tournament semifinals on Saturday. North Bullitt would play West Jessamine with a chance to play in the state championship match on the line.

In any five-set match there are a lot of points to be earned. North Bullitt had 32 assists by sophomore setter Brian Hammons. At the net, the high-flying Childers had 21 kills while senior Hunter Puckett had eight and Butler six.

On defense, the Eagles had 31 'digs' by freshman libero Eli Brooks as well as 17 by both Hammons and Childers. Xander Cash, a junior finished with 16 'digs.' There were not a lot of 'blocks' in this match by either team. North Bullitt did have four by freshman Martin Duran and three by sophomore Austin Coy.
