

Local golfers closing in on start of high school season

GLASGOW – A two-day event for the older golfers was held on June 29-30. Several golfers in the boys' under 19 event from the region did well on the leaderboard. Jase Jessie of Campbellsville had the best score with a 14-over 155 over the 36 holes. He finished in 16th place. Right behind in 17th place was Rock Latkovski of Shepherdsville. The Bullitt Central golfer carted a 15-over 156. In the boys' 11-12, which was a nine-hole event over the two days, Elizabethtown's Redick Johnson placed second with a seven-over 79.

He was five strokes ahead of Mason Day of Leitchfield. He finished fourth with his score of 84. In the boys' 10 and under, also a nine-hole event each day, Elizabethtown's Connor Johnson was 10th with a 56-over 128. Shelbyville Country Club Juniors went to Shelbyville on June 1 to compete in another BGT event. In the boys' 19 and under, Rowan Whitehouse of Simpsonville was the top finisher in the region. He carted a 4-over 40 to tie for fifth place. Wyatt Lilford of Shelbyville tied for 10th place with his score of 43,

seven over par. Shepherdsville's Jacob Powell had a seven-over 43 to also tie for 10th place. Lucien Barnett of Shelbyville carted an eight-over 48 to place in a tie for 11th. In the boys' 15 and under, Luke Meredith of Prospect was the high golfer from the local region. He was all alone in fourth place with his six-over 42. Parker Lafferty of Shelbyville tied for fifth with an eight-over 44. Peyton Whitson of Simpsonville was ninth with his 48. And Dylan Kleinholter of LaGrange was tie for 11th with a 13-over 49.

In the boys 14 and under, Shelbyville's Trayden Tinsley tied with Bardstown's Braden Hutchins for first place with a four-over 40. Colt Owens of Simpsonville was tied for fourth with a seven-over 43. Conner Bybee of Prospect was tied for ninth with a score of 12-over 48. In the boys 11-12, Crestwood's Brantley Williams took top prize with a six-over 42. In the boys 10 and under, Shelbyville's Parker Willard was tied for third with his 12-over 48. Old Bridge Golf Club in Danville In the boys 19 and under, Jase Jessie of Campbellsville won first

with a one-under 35. Landon Atcher of Elizabethtown was eighth with an 11-over 47. In the boys 15 and under, Jack Riddell of Prospect was third with a 12-over 48. In the boys 14 and under, Braden Hutchins of Bardstown finished in first place with a one-over 37. Chase Atcher of Elizabethtown placed seventh with a 44. In the girls 15 and under, Ellie Moody of LaGrange finished in fourth place with a seven-over 43. In the boys 11-12, Hayden Hoover of Fisherville had a nine-hole round of 12-over 48 to earn second place.
