The lone touchdown for the Dolphins was scored by Letty Wohner as she led her team with 57 rushing yards. The team also got 23 yards from Miya Belmar, 7-yards by Hayden Hanley and 1-yard by Nora Summers.

On the other side of the ball, Belmar had four flags while three flags were pulled by Hanley, Elsie Sawyer and Wohner. Summers had two flags.

CO-ED FLAG FOOTBALL

In an early afternoon game on Saturday, the Mount Washington Colts got past the Lebanon Junction Seahawks by a 22-16 score.

The stat sheet from the Colts did not list who scored the points. It did show that Brock Sharp

rushed for 128 yards while Karson Dockery had 58 yards on the ground. The Colts also got 47 yards from Onyx Sanders as well as 10-yards by Madden Bernard, 5-yards by Jaxson Philpot and 1-yard by Olivia Goodman.

Sharp also led the team with four flags while Bernard had three and Dockery two.

Both of the touchdowns and one of the extra points for the Seahawks were scored by Khalil Mallory as he rushed for 183 yards. The team also got 15-yards on the ground by Brock Boggs and 10-yards by Wyatt Garvin. Gavin had an extra point.

The Seahawks got three flags each from Mallory, Keanu Hardin and Boggs.

The Overdale Chiefs had a strong day as the team defeated the Pleasant Grove Dolphins 32-0. Two

of the scores for the Chiefs were scored by Justin Whited who rushed for 140 yards in the win. The offense also got a touchdown and an extra point from Kareem White who rushed for 75 yards. Knylan Harbison rushed for 74 yards with a touchdown while Korbyn Walden had a touchdown and an extra point while rushing for 20-yards. Liam Adkins rushed for 10-yards with an extra point.

On defense, the Chiefs had seven flags by White along with four by Walden. Harbison had three flags while Anthony Lopez had two.

The offense for the Dolphins got 33-yards on the ground from Jonah Escamilla along with 28-yards by Lucas Bowman and 9-yards by Lucas Eaton.

The stat sheet did not

show more than one flag for any single player for the Dolphins.

There was plenty of offense in a mid-afternoon game before the Cedar Grove Vikings turned back the Brooks Buccaneers by a 36-18 score.

Leading the way for the Vikings was Tripp Smith who rushed for 180 yards with three touchdowns. Ollie Baggett had 70-yards and a touchdown while Cameron Hinton rushed for 80 yards with a touchdown and an extra point. Benjamin Earnhart had an extra point while Silas Steiger rushed for 15 yards.

Unfortunately, no stat sheet was turned in by the Buccaneers.

In a late afternoon game on Saturday, the Maryville Patriots turned back the Fairdale Bulldogs by a 22-6 score.

Two of the scores for the Patriots were posted by Grayson Berson who rushed for 126 yards. Mar’Ryan Allen rushed for a touchdown and two extra points. The stat sheet also says that Allen had a pair of safeties but then the final score does not add up correctly. The offense also had a 4-yard pass from Jayce Nylund to Berson.

Allen was the top tackler for the Patriots with seven while Berson had five.

The only touchdown for the Bulldogs was scored by Knoxtyn Hess as he rushed for 10-yards. The offense also got 49 yards on the ground by Ace Gibson and 45-yards by Karter Kroeger. Ambrose Boyd added 5-yards of offense.

Kroeger led the way on defense with eight flags.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE AD VALOREM TAX RATE FOR MOTOR VEHICLES AND WATERCRAFT FOR THE CITY OF SHEPHERDSVILLE, KENTUCKY FOR THE 2027 CALENDAR YEAR.

SUMMARY

SECTION ONE: An ad valorem tax rate of 12.5 cents on each \$100.00 (one hundred dollars) of assessed valuation upon all motor vehicles and watercraft taxable for municipal purposes in the City of Shepherdsville, Kentucky shall be and is hereby levied for the 2027 calendar year, as of January 1, 2027.

SECTION TWO: Sets forth the purpose of this levy.

SECTION THREE: These taxes shall be collected by the Bullitt County Clerk as provided by KRS 132.487 et seq., and the City Clerk is hereby directed to forward to the Department of Revenue, Office of Property Valuation, 501 High Street, Station 32, 4th Floor, Frankfort, Kentucky 40601, a 2027 Motor Vehicle Tax Rate Classification for the 2027 calendar year. Any tax bill remaining unpaid for sixty (60) days after the due date as established by the Commonwealth of Kentucky, will be declared DELINQUENT and bear interest at six (6%) per annum, or one half (1/2) of one percent (1 %) per month or a fraction thereof until paid; and in addition, thereto, a penalty of ten percent (10%) of the amount for general purposes shall be added for non-payment when due.

SECTION FOUR: Sets forth the severability clause.

SECTION FIVE: Sets forth the repeal of prior ordinances in conflict with this ordinance.

SECTION SIX: Sets forth the publication requirement.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE AD VALOREM TAX RATE FOR TANGIBLE PERSONAL PROPERTY AND PROPERTY OF PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANIES FOR THE CITY OF SHEPHERDSVILLE, KENTUCKY FOR THE 2026 CALENDAR YEAR.

SUMMARY

SECTION ONE: An ad valorem tax rate of 10.10 cents on each \$100.00 (one hundred dollars) or assessed valuation upon all tangible property taxable and property of public services companies for municipal purposes, except property assessed by the State, in the City of Shepherdsville, Kentucky shall be and is hereby levied for the 2026 calendar year, as of January 1, 2026.

SECTION TWO: Sets forth the purpose of this levy.

SECTION THREE: Sets forth that the City adopts the Bullitt County PVA’s 2026 assessments and will prepare City tax bills from those records.

SECTION FOUR: Sets forth that the City Clerk shall add to the City tax rolls any persons or property within the City not listed in the Bullitt County PVA’s records.

SECTION FIVE: The Bullitt County Sheriff shall be and is hereby directed to prepare tax bills for all persons and organizations in the City of Shepherdsville, Kentucky against whom said taxes have been levied. The Bullitt County Sheriff is hereby directed to notify such persons and organizations by mail that on and after January 1, 2027, through January 31, 2027, any tax bill remaining unpaid will be declared DELINQUENT and shall bear interest at five percent (5%) for that period. On or after February 1, 2027, through April 15, 2027, the interest shall be ten percent (10%) plus a ten percent (10%) add-on fee. The Bullitt County Sheriff shall also indicate that a discount of two percent (2%) will be allowed on bills paid on or before November 1, 2026.

SECTION SIX: Sets forth that all payments shall be made to the Bullitt County Sheriff.

SECTION SEVEN: Sets forth the severability clause.

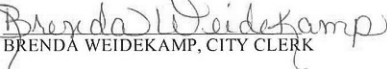
SECTION THREE: All prior ordinances or parts of any prior ordinance in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

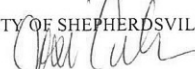

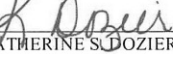
