North Bullitt did start better in the fourth game, bolting to a 9-6 lead at one point. Bullitt East tied the match at 12. The contest was tied five times in the late teens before Bullitt >East scored the final five points to secure the 25-20 set and match.

“We started well, but then unfortunately we got out of rhythm,” Scott said. “we did not stick to the plan we discussed.”

Adapting to what Bodytko was doing was a help to the Lady Chargers.

“I knew she would play. I saw her against CAL,” Adams said of watching a tape of North Bullitt’s match against

Christian Academy when she returned to the court. “I was keeping up with it. She is a special player.”

“I thought we did a good job changing the trajectory on her hits,” the coach explained. “When she is clean, she is very tough.”

‘aces’ but three were by Aubrey Brown.

On defense, both Brown and Sophie Gorter had 21 ‘digs’ while Mad-die Sturgeon had 17.

North Bullitt’s stats for the match had not been posted by early this week.

The Lady Eagles started play this week with a 9-6 record.

With the district race decided, the team can focus on the post-season.

“At this point with the district over, we know we’ll be the runner-up,” Scott said. “Our focus now is to finish strong and see which district number one we will see in the post-season.”

Bullitt East played in Sevierville, Tenn., this past weekend and will start play this weekend with a 15-4 record.

“I think we are playing

about where I thought we would be at this point,” Adams said of his squad. “The first goal was to get to the Super Regional (as a number one seed). We did not have the number one seed last and now we do. That is big.”

Bullitt Central

The Lady Cougars played twice last week and won both matches.

On Tuesday, the

maroon and gray rolled past Presentation 25-18, 25-14, 25-23 on the road. Bullitt Central returned home on Wednesday and defeated Sixth Region rival Butler 25-17, 25-23.

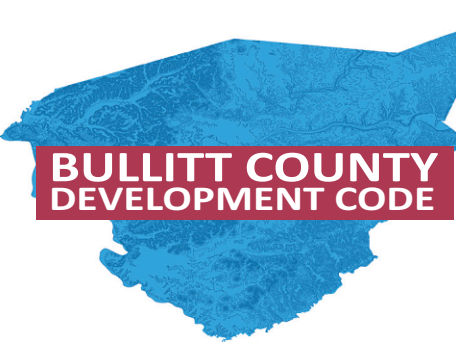
In this match, Addison Booth had ten ‘kills’ while Natalie Hibbard had nine.

AN ORDINANCE LEVYING REAL PROPERTY ADV ALO REM TAXES AND PROVIDING ASSESSMENT, EQUALIZATION AND COLLECTION PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF KRS 92.280, ET. SEQ.
BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Hebron Estates, Bullitt County, Kentucky as follows:
SECTION ONE: A real property ad valorem tax of 7.703 cents on each \$100.00 value of all property taxable for municipal purposes, except property assessed by the State, in said City is hereby levied for the year 2026 as of January 1, 2026.
SECTION TWO: Said levy is made for the purpose of raising revenue to pay salaries of officers and employees; for the repair and maintenance of street, public ways, and public buildings in said city; to pay for lighting city streets; and to pay all proper charges and legal demands against the city.
SECTION THREE: The assessment made by the Bullitt County Property Valuation Administrator for State and County purposes for 2026 shall be and is hereby adopted as the assessment for City purposes. The City tax bills shall be made from the county list in the Property Valuation Administrator's books after they have been supervised and corrected by the County Board of Equalization.
SECTION FOUR: The City Clerk shall take the list of all persons subject to City taxation who are not shown on the County Property Valuation Administrator's books and shall add to the City Tax Rolls all property a portion of which is in the city where the value of the portion in the city is not shown on the Property Valuation Administrator's books.
SECTION FIVE: The City Clerk be and she is hereby directed to prepare tax bills for all persons and organizations in the City of Hebron Estates, Bullitt County, Kentucky, against whom taxes have been levied. She is hereby directed to notify such persons and organizations by mail that on and after January 1, 2027, any tax bill remaining unpaid will be declared DELINQUENT and bear interest at twelve percent (12%) per annum, or one percent (1 %) per month or a fraction thereof until paid; and in addition thereto, a penalty of ten percent (10%) of the amount for general purposes shall be added for non-payment when due. Said Clerk shall also indicate that a discount of two percent (2%) will be allowed on bills paid before October 30, 2026.
SECTION SIX: All payments of taxes provided for herein shall be made to the City Clerk/Treasurer at the business office of City of Hebron Estates, 3407 Burkland Blvd., Shepherdsville, Kentucky 40165 or P. O. Box 416, Hillview, Kentucky 40129.
SECTION SEVEN: After January 1, 2027, the Clerk will mark all unpaid tax bills in red ink DELINQUENT and add a penalty of ten percent (10%) as provided herein and report to the City Council the number of unpaid bills and the amount thereof. The Mayor will check all tax bills and correct errors, if any, and deliver the tax books back to the Clerk who will proceed with the collection of all delinquent taxes, penalty, and interest and will report to the City Council at its regular meeting each month.
SECTION EIGHT: The Clerk is directed to advertise this Ordinance as provided by law.
SECTION NINE: Any ordinance or parts of ordinance in conflict with this Ordinance or any part of this Ordinance is hereby repealed.
SECTION TEN: Should any section, clause, line, paragraph, or part of this Ordinance be held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the same shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Hunters Hollow, Bullitt County, Kentucky as follows:

SECTION ONE: A real property ad valorem tax of 7.321 cents on each \$100.00 of value of all real property taxable for municipal purposes except property assessed by the State, in said City, is hereby levied for the year 2026 as of January 1, 2026.

SECTION TWO: Said levy is made for the purpose of raising revenue to pay salaries of officers and employees; for the repair and maintenance of streets, public ways, and public buildings in said City; to pay for lighting city streets; and to pay all proper charges and legal demands against the City.

SECTION THREE: The assessment made by the Bullitt County Property Valuation Administrator for State and County purposes for 2026 shall be and is hereby adopted as the assessment for City purposes. The City tax bills shall be made from the county list in the Property Valuation Administrator's books after they have been supervised and corrected by the County Board of Equalization.

SECTION FOUR: The City Clerk hasll take the list of all persons subject to City taxation who are not shown on the County Property Valuation Administrator's books and shall add to the City Tax Rolls all prperty a portion of which is in the City where the value of the portion in the City is not shown on the Property Valuation Administrator's book.

SECTION FIVE: The City Clerk be and she is hereby directed to prepare tax bills for all persons and organizations in the City of Hunters Hollow, Bullitt County, Kentucky, against whom taxes have been levied and she is hereby directed to notify such persons and organizations by mail that on and after January 1, 2027, any tax bill remaining unpaid will be declared DELINQUENT and bear interest at twelve percent (12%) per annum, or one percent (1%) per month or a fraction thereof until paid; and in addition thereto, a penalty of ten percent (10%) of the amount for general purposes shall be added for non-payment when due. Said Clerk shall also indicate that a discount of two percent (2%) will be allowed on bills paid before November 1, 2026.

SECTION SIX: All payments of taxes provided for herein shall be made to the City Clerk/Treasurer at the business office of City of Hunters Hollow, 11300 Angelina Road, Louisville, Kentucky 40229.

SECTION SEVEN: After January 1, 2027, the Clerk will mark all unpaid tax bills in red ink DELINQUENT and add a penalty of ten percent (10%) as provided herein and report to the City Council the number of unpaid bills and the amount thereof and the Mayor will check all tax bills and correct errors, if any, and delivery the tax books back to the Clerk who will proceed with the collection of all delinquent taxes, penalty, and interest and will report to the City Council at its regular meeting each month.

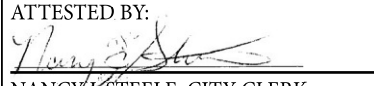
