play called back for a personal foul penalty, the first of many in the game on both sides.

Holy Cross had a holding penalty on first down near midfield but then went forward with three plays of at least 11 yards. Hoover had a 24-yard scamper to the 8-yard line and two plays later King scored again.

Looking for anything to turn the game around, Bullitt Central moved the ball quickly over the last four minutes of the half on the move. The team picked up five first downs and after a 23-yard pass from Lee to Carter Still, the ball was at the 8-yard line. A face mask penalty moved the ball half the distance to the goal line.

Twice more Holy Cross had penalties that kept inching the ball closer to the line. On the first of three consecutive fourth down plays, in the final eight-seconds, Holy Cross was called for holding and then on the next try there was a pass interference penalty that put the ball on the 1-yard line.

On a final untimed down following the penalties, the Cougars botched the play as the snap hit a player in motion and bounced backwards, ending another red zone threat.

Even at 20-0 at halftime, Bullitt Central was still in the game. That was especially true when Hoover's pass on the third play of the second half was intercepted by Still, who returned it all the way to the 7-yard line.

However, on the next play Lee was intercepted in the end zone.

If not already out of control, the exchange of the turnovers led to a flurry of major penalties on both teams. The rest of the game was more in the hands of the officials than the coaches and players and the more calls they made, the more the coaches and play-

ers got frustrated on both teams.

Holy Cross did a better job overcoming the calls on the field. The visiting team got a 35-yard touchdown run by Hoover with 5:40 remaining in the third quarter, a play that pushed the margin to 27-0.

Bullitt Central did score its lone touchdown on the next series. The big play was the 45-yard pass from Lee to Selch. Nusz' touchdown came at the 2:36 mark with Declan Flaherty kicking the extra point.

That was the high-water mark for the home fans.

Holy Cross scored on the final play of the third quarter. Hoover had a 50-yard run on the first play after recovering an on-sides kick himself. That play was wiped out by off-setting personal fouls. The visitors finally did score when Malachi Watkins took a pass in the flat, ran all the way to one sideline and then reversed field and ran all the way to his own sideline and scored on the 18-yard

scramble.

The final touchdown of the game came early in the fourth quarter. When King ran 60-yards for a score, Holy Cross went for two-points to force a running clock for the final 9:48 of the game.

Twice Bullitt Central appeared to score in the fourth quarter only to have both plays called back due to penalties. Lee scrambled and raced 49 yards down the sideline to the endzone, but a mystery illegal block down field erased most of the run.

Later in the drive, Bullitt Central reached the 5-yard line and Lee connected with Tyler Cavote in the back of the endzone. That play was called back for an illegal receiver down field (who makes that call with 1:16 remaining in a 35-point game).

The outcome was just not the way Bullitt Central saw this game unfolding.

"It was very frustrating," Faucett said as he picked his words carefully to avoid

problems with the officials. "I was proud of our kids. They played hard all night.

"We just have to execute better on offense and tackle better on defense," the coach added. "We had them for some short gains and did not finish the play."

Bullitt Central had 268 yards of total offense evenly split between rushing and passing. Lee rushed the ball 12 times for 88 yards while Nusz had 15 carries for 39 yards.

Lee was limited to completing just nine of his 24 pass attempts for 134 yards. He was intercepted once. Most of the damage was done on four passes to Selch for 73 yards.

Holy Cross had 464 yards of total offense with 307 of that coming on the ground.

Hoover was 17 of 22 for

157 yards. King had a big game on the ground with ten carries for 189 yards with three touchdowns. Hoover rushed 11 times for 100 yards and two scores.

Next Game: It will be homecoming for the Cougars this week as they will also start district play with a game on Friday against Moore. The Mustangs have started the season 3-2 after a 29-0 win over Doss on Friday.

The traditional Homecoming parade will be along the normal course on Thursday starting at 6 p.m.

The football game on Friday has a 7:30 p.m. start time. Homecoming festivities will be at halftime.

For the first time in history, all three high schools will celebrate Homecoming on the same Friday night.

ORDINANCE NO. 26-21

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, Bullitt Fiscal Court has determined that the general welfare of the citizens of Bullitt County is directly related to the economic and employment opportunities available to them, and it is the legitimate business of Bullitt County Fiscal Court to provide to the maximum extent practicable, the impetus for and assistance to economic development in Bullitt County which will directly and proximately cause the improvement and retention of industry and employment in Bullitt County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FISCAL COURT OF COUNTY OF BULLITT, COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I: DEFINITIONS

"Community and Economic Development Authority" means the Department of Bullitt County Government tasked with economic development activities created by this Ordinance.

"Industrial sites, parks and subdivisions" means land and improvements thereon, including buildings, fixtures, and equipment, suitable for one (1) or more manufacturers, industries or commercial establishments.

"Development of land" means the improvement and provision of facilities essential to the use of land for manufacturing, industrial, and commercial purposes such as, but not limited to, core drilling, grading, sewerage systems, water systems, access roads, rail lines, electrical lines, layout planning, and the construction and equipping of buildings.

SECTION II: ESTABLISHMENT

Bullitt County Fiscal Court does hereby establish and constitute a Department of Bullitt County Government to be known as the Community and Economic Development Authority, hereinafter referred to as "the Authority."

SECTION III: PURPOSE, DUTIES AND POWERS

The purpose, duties, and powers of the Authority shall be as follows:

(a) Recommend to Bullitt County Fiscal Court the acquiring, retention, and development land for industrial and commercial purposes in Bullitt County and aid in the development and promotion of industrial sites, parks, and subdivisions to meet industrial and commercial needs in Bullitt County.

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(b) Encourage the acquisition, retention, and development of land for industrial and commercial needs in Bullitt County by other local development organizations, both public and private.

(c) Cooperate with the United States Army Corps of Engineers and other federal agencies in formulating development plans and in acquiring and developing land for industrial and commercial purposes in accordance with these plans.

(d) Recommend to Bullitt County Fiscal Court the acquiring by contract, lease, purchase, gift, condemnation, or otherwise any real or personal property, or rights therein, necessary or suitable for establishing industrial sites, parks, or subdivisions.

(e) Recommend to Bullitt County Fiscal Court the disposal of any real or personal property, or rights therein, on the opinion of the Authority are no longer needed to carry out the purposes of the Authority.

(f) Recommend to Bullitt County Fiscal Court the Lease, sell, or conveyance of any or all industrial sites, parks, and subdivisions owned or operated by Bullitt County Fiscal Court or the Authority to any public or private organization, governmental unit, or industry for the purpose of constructing and/or operating any manufacturing, industrial, or commercial facility. Provided, however, that no sale or conveyance of any land shall be made to a private organization or industry without such organization or industry first having executed a written contract with the Authority providing that if no actual construction of a manufacturing, industrial, or commercial facility, as set forth in the executed contract, is commenced within ten (10) years, the organization or industry shall offer to reconvey the land, free and clear of liens and encumbrances, to the Authority, and should the Authority accept the offer of reconveyance, it shall return to the organization or industry ninety-five percent (95%) of the purchase price paid therefor.

SECTION IV: MEMBERSHIP

The Authority shall be operated by an Advisory Board composed of six (6) members. Each of the following entities shall appoint one member to the Authority: Bullitt County Judge Executive, Mayor of Mount Washington, Mayor of Shepherdsville, Mayor of Hillview, Mayor of Lebanon Junction, and Bullitt County Chamber of Commerce. Members of the Authority shall serve for a term of four (4) years each, and until their successors are appointed and qualified. Initial appointments shall be made so that two (2) members are appointed for two (2) years, two (2) members for three (3) years, and two (2) members for four (4) years. Upon expiration of these staggered terms, successors shall be appointed for a term of four (4) years. A member may be replaced by his or her appointing authority upon a showing of misconduct as an Authority member by or upon conviction of a felony.

SECTION V: QUORUM

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A quorum for the transacting of the business of the Authority shall consist of four (4) members. Meetings of the Authority may be called by the chairman or by four (4) members. In case of tie voting by the Authority, the issue shall be deemed to have failed passage.

SECTION VI: ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Members of the Authority shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for any actual and necessary expenses incurred by them in the conduct of the affairs of the Authority. The Authority shall, upon the appointment of its members, organize and elect officers. The Authority shall choose a chairman and vice chairman who shall serve for terms of one (1) year. The Authority may fix a salary for the secretary-treasurer, and the secretary-treasurer shall execute an official bond to be set and approved by the Authority, and the cost thereof shall be paid by the Authority.

SECTION VII: EMPLOYMENT

Bullitt County Fiscal Court shall be responsible for the employment of necessary counsel, agents and employees to carry out its work and functions and prescribe such rules and regulations as it deems necessary.

SECTION VIII: SECRETARY

The secretary shall keep the minutes of all meetings of the Authority.

SECTION IX: APPROPRIATION

In order to provide money for the purchase of property necessary to develop industrial sites, parks, and subdivisions, Bullitt County Fiscal Court may make an annual appropriation from its general fund for such industrial development. Any appropriation shall be made in such amounts, in such proportion, and upon such terms as Bullitt County Fiscal Court may determine. All funds derived from such appropriation shall be held by Bullitt County Fiscal Court. Any and all activities of the Authority shall be funded by Bullitt County Fiscal Court in its discretion.

SECTION X: BORROWING MONEY

The Authority does not have the power to borrow money, issue notes or other financial instruments on its own credit. The funding of the Authority shall be made by Bullitt Fiscal Court in the Fiscal Court's discretion.

SECTION XI: REVENUE BONDS

The Authority does not have the power to issue Revenue Bonds. Any such undertaking is at the discretion and in the power of Bullitt County Fiscal Court.

SECTION XII: TITLE TO PROPERTY

The title to all property acquired pursuant to this Ordinance shall vest in Bullitt County Fiscal Court. All property acquired for the development of industrial sites, parks and subdivisions shall be exempt from taxation to the same extent as other property used for

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public purposes. All revenues collected shall also be exempt from taxation.

SECTION XIII: PUBLIC PURPOSE

The acquisition of any lands for the purpose of developing industrial sites, parks and subdivisions is hereby declared to be a public and governmental function, exercised for a public purpose, and a matter of public necessity, and such lands and other property, easements and privileges acquired in the manner and for the purposes enumerated in KRS 154.50-301 to 154.50-346 shall and are hereby declared to be acquired and used for public and governmental purposes and as a matter of public necessity.

SECTION XIV: SEVERABILITY

Invalidity of any section or portion of any section of this Ordinance shall not operate to invalidate any section or portion of this Ordinance not otherwise invalid.

SECTION XV: REPEALER

The 1982 Bullitt County Ordinance relating to the establishment of an Industrial Development Authority is hereby REPEALED along with any other ordinance in conflict with this Ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A HAZARDOUS WASTE CLEAN UP BILLING SYSTEM IN BULLITT COUNTY, KENTUCKY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FISCAL COURT OF COUNTY OF BULLITT, COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY:

SUMMARY

1. Sets forth the definitions.
2. Sets forth the responsibilities of the BCMA Director.
3. Sets forth the requirement that handlers of hazardous materials who store said materials for more than thirty (30) days shall notify the Director.
4. Sets forth the responsibilities of the hazardous materials handlers.
5. Sets forth that BCMA is authorized to respond to and abate the effects of released or threatened to be released hazardous materials to minimize potential harm.
6. Sets forth that BCMA may recover costs expended, including, but not limited to, personnel costs of the BCMA and other dispatched emergency workers responding to the release or threatened release, replacement costs of supplies and equipment contaminated as a result of the incident, the cost of proper disposal of contaminated materials, the cost of cleanup, evacuation, and administrative and other expenses, including legal expenses, incurred in recovering these costs. Further sets forth that BCMA is authorized to engage a billing company to assist with billing and collection.
7. Sets forth that the Director is responsible for enforcement of this Ordinance.
8. Sets forth that invalidity of any section or portion of any section of this Ordinance shall not operate to invalidate any section or portion of this Ordinance not otherwise invalid.
9. Sets forth that any Ordinance in conflict with this Ordinance is hereby REPEALED.
10. Sets forth that this Ordinance shall be published in Summary.
