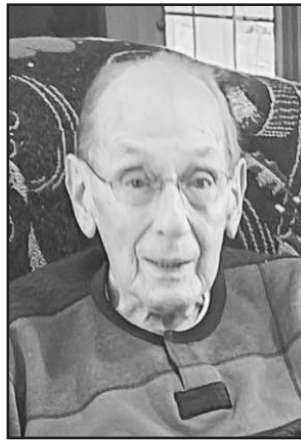
There is no charge to attend, but guests are asked to “just bring a snack to share.” The Class of 1969 is hosting the event.

Let God's Love Flow Through Your Life

Q: I'm new in church. I'm surprised about the amount of gossiping, lying, and betrayal among church people. It seems like people outside the church do a better job of showing love than Christians do. Why aren't people in the church more loving?

A: Your observation of negative talk and actions is spot on. There's far too much contention among church people. When we cause

hurt feelings, it is not Christlike. The devil is pleased when Christians harm one another. All contention in the church is a negative witness for Christ in the community.

God's Word tells us, "Love one another, because God is love" (1 Jn. 4:7). God's very nature is love. When we express genuine love to others, we are exhibiting God's nature.

God not only gives His children His nature of love, He gave them His Son, Jesus, to live

out His love through them. His Word explicitly affirms this truth, "God sent his one and only Son into the world so that we might live through him" (1 Jn. 4:9). If you are having a hard time loving someone, remember you live through Christ. Ask Jesus, who lives in you, to help you love that person. You have the capacity to love that person because it is Christ in you doing the loving.

Every Christian needs to become more

loving to everyone and particularly to one's Christian brothers and sisters in the church. Strive to be a growing Christian who is becoming more like God and to exhibit His nature of love every day. It may be a slow process, but the very fact that He hasn't given up on us and that we are becoming more loving, more patient, and more kind as we learn from Him is proof of His unconditional love for us.
