MCC Partners To Expand Emergency Medical Services-Paramedic Program

Madisonville Community College, in partnership with the West Area Health Education Center (AHEC), is expanding financial and career development support for students enrolled in the college's Emergency Medical Services-Paramedic program to address a critical workforce need across western Kentucky.

medical services professionals continues to rise locally and nationwide. According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, employment of EMTs and paramedics is projected to grow 5 percent from 2024 to 2034, faster than the average for all occupations, with approximately 19,000 openings each year.

Through partnerships with Baptist Health Deaconess Madisonville and the City of Madisonville, students in the MCC EMS-Paramedic program gain the advanced clinical training required for licensure and employment in a variety of real-world settings, including ambulance services, hospitals, and fire departments. The program also provides a pathway to additional healthcare careers, including nursing and other advanced medical professions.

Through the AHEC Scholars program, eligible students will receive stipends tied to completion of career development activities, along with access to scholarship funding to offset tuition costs. This additional support is intended to remove outside barriers that students might encounter while strengthening their on-campus experience. The initiative comes at a time when demand for emergency

In Kentucky, however, the need is even more urgent. State data show persistent shortages of EMS personnel, with workforce attrition rates around 21 percent and the number of newly trained paramedics failing to keep pace with those leaving the profession. These shortages are compounded by increased demand for services, with tens of thousands more ambulance transport requests annually
