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Storm, both of whom voiced support for Barr’s Senate bid. “Last Saturday... we kicked off the statewide Veterans Military Coalition down in Richmond and I had the honor and privilege to be able to introduce our next senator,” Gen. Storm said. “There’s never been a greater champion for veterans and military personnel — and get this, their families — than Congressman Andy Barr.”

Sen. Storm also thanked Barr for showing up for southeastern Kentucky.

“I think Congressman Barr is the correct person for this position because I’ve been with him in far east Kentucky, I’ve been with him here in Laurel County [on] several occasions,” he said. “He’s been right here. He’s broken bread with people and the other candidates just haven’t done that.”

When Barr took the podium, he emphasized the significance of the race and the rarity of an open Senate seat.

“This is an important decision — 42 years, we haven’t had an opportunity to elect a new senator and we are losing influence in Washington, D.C.,” he said.

Barr pointed to his congressional experience as a strength, which includes a narrow loss by 647 votes before winning a seat in a competitive district two years later and holding it since. He framed that experience as evidence of both political resilience and a record of constituent service.

He spent much of his remarks focusing on policy priorities central to his Senate campaign, particularly immigration and border security. Barr referenced his record of supporting stronger immigration enforcement measures and increased support for border security operations.

The congressman additionally stressed his alignment with President Donald Trump’s agenda, saying he has worked with the administration on tax policy, deregulation, energy production and immigration enforcement.

Further, Barr highlighted what he described as Kentucky’s broad economic strengths, referencing coal, agriculture and manufacturing, and argued that those industries should have strong representation in Washington.

As for matters he finds particularly pressing, Barr commented that his top priorities if elected would be national security and “lowering the cost of living, mainly through decreasing regulation, continuing to lower taxes for working families, unleashing our energy sector, [and] putting our coal miners back to work so that we can power these technologies in the future and attract these new jobs to Kentucky.”

Regarding rural healthcare, he noted that he has advocated for rural hospitals, critical access hospitals, and federally qualified health centers, earning the 2024 Distinguished Community Health Center Advocate Award from the National Association of Community Health Centers.

Barr pointed to ongoing shortages of doctors, nurses, and other healthcare workers as an issue for such hospitals, stating that addressing reimbursement and compensation issues could help draw more professionals into the field.

Following his remarks, Barr took questions from community members before closing out the event by meeting attendees personally and posing for photos.
