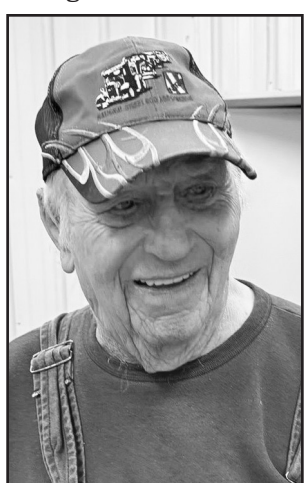
He is survived by two sons, David Jo-
