

# Baseball, Softball Teams Split Games In Monday Action

The Union County Braves and Bravettes played games on Monday night.

The Braves hosted Whitesville Trinity and dropped a 5-3 decision to the Raiders. The Bravettes found themselves in a slugfest with Caldwell County. Union County posted a 15-11 win in that game.

## Whitesville Trinity – 5 Union County – 3

In the baseball action, Union County took an early lead and had scoring opportunities in the final two innings. Rallies fell short in both frames, and Union County lost the game, 5-3.

Union County got the game's first run in the bottom of the first inning when Grayson O'Daniel doubled to centerfield. He moved to third on an error by the Trinity pitcher. After a walk to Bentley Duckworth, O'Daniel scored on a sacrifice fly off the bat of Max No-

bles, and Union County held a 1-0 lead.

Whitesville Trinity answered with two runs in the top of the second inning and three more runs in the top of the third. As the game neared the halfway point, the Raiders opened a 5-1 cushion.

Union County did not score again until the sixth inning when B. Duckworth singled and stole second. Nobles was hit by a pitch. Duckworth stole third and scored on a single by Garrison Thomas. That rally ended one batter later, but the Braves had cut their deficit to 5-2.

The Braves scored another run in the seventh inning. Liam Yoshida lashed a one out double to left field. Cody Heppler followed with a single, sending Yoshida to third base. A walk to Damon Utley gave the Braves two base runners. Yoshida stole home for Union County's third run,

but a fly out ended the game, and Whitesville Trinity claimed the 5-3 win.

Union County had five hits in the game. The Braves committed four errors on defense.

O'Daniel, B. Duckworth, Thomas, Yoshida, and Heppler had one hit each. Nobles and Thomas batted in one run apiece for Union County.

Duckworth started the game for the Braves and worked six innings. He allowed four hits, walked two batters, and recorded six strikeouts. Utley pitched an inning of relief. He walked one batter and had one strikeout.

Duckworth was the losing pitcher.

## Union County – 15 Caldwell County – 11

Playing on the road at Caldwell County, the Bravettes needed extra innings to come away with a tough 15-11 win over the Lady Tigers.

The teams played

two scoreless innings before Union County got on the scoreboard with two runs in the top of the third inning. The Bravettes used two singles and a fielder's choice to score those runs.

Caldwell County answered with two runs in the bottom of the third.

Union County plated two more runs in the top of the fifth inning. The Bravettes had three singles and took advantage of two Caldwell County errors to open a 4-2 lead.

The Lady Tigers scored twice in the bottom of the fifth inning to knot the score 4-4.

Union County scored a single run in the sixth inning and added two more runs in the seven to take a 7-4 lead.

Caldwell County knotted the score 7-7 with three runs in the bottom of the seventh inning and the game went to extra innings.

In the eighth inning, Union County broke the game open with eight runs. The Bravettes had five hits and a walk in the inning and opened the 15-7 cushion.

Caldwell County rallied for four runs in the

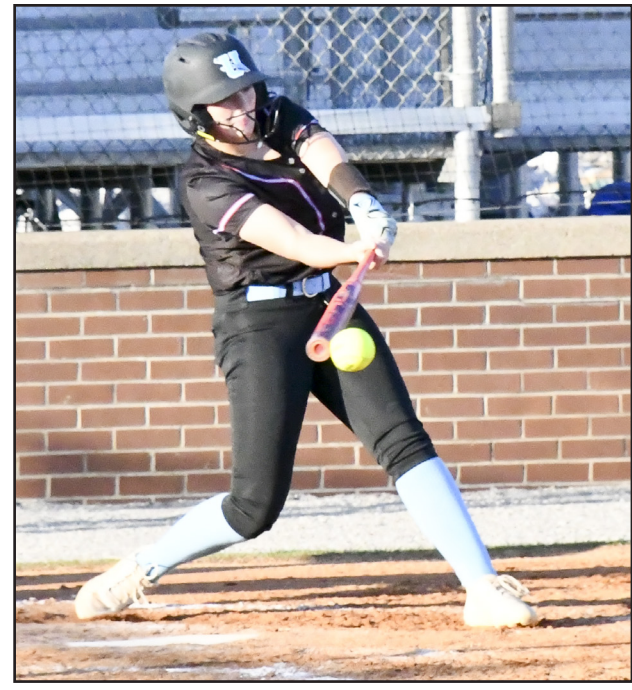
bottom of the eighth, but Union County stopped that run and took the 15-11 win.

The Bravettes banged out 14 hits in the game. Union County committed four errors on defense.

Brylee Jackson had three hits for the Bravettes. Ella Arnett, Miley Mendoza, Karley Byrd, Daylee Shelton, and Audrey Staley had two hits each. Miley Mosley was credited with one hit.

Mendoza batted in four runs for Union County. Shelton and Staley had two RBI apiece, and Jackson, Arnett, and Mosley had one RBI each.

Byrd got the start for Union County and pitched seven and a third innings. She allowed seven hits, walked three batters and had five strikeouts. Mosley pitched in relief. She gave up four hits and had a strikeout.

## Bravettes Lost 14-4 To Henderson County

The Union County Bravettes played a Sixth District game last week, that being a 14-4 Henderson County on Thursday. Another contest earlier in the week against Caldwell County was canceled due to inclement weather.

In the game at Henderson County, the Bravettes got on the scoreboard in the top of the first inning when Audrey Staley drew a walk and stole second base. She advanced to third base on a single by Ashlynn Hargrove. Staley scored on an error by the Henderson County catcher, and Union County held an early 1-0 lead.

The Lady Colonels plated a single run in the bottom of the first inning to tie the score. Henderson County took control of the game in the second frame when five runs scored. Henderson County had six hits in the second inning.

The Lady Colonels added another run in the bottom of the third to open a 7-1 lead.

Union County trimmed that margin to just three runs in the top of the fourth inning. Hargrove opened the inning with a single, and after an out Karley Byrd singled to center field. Miley Mendoza followed with a three

run home run to center field, and the Bravettes trimmed their deficit to 7-4.

That is as close as Union County would get, as the Lady Colonels scored two runs in the bottom of the fourth inning and added five more runs in the bottom of the fifth to open the 14-4 lead. The game was stopped after five innings by the 10-run rule.

Union County had four hits in the game. A porous Bravettes defense committed seven errors.

Hargrove had two hits for Union County, and Byrd and Mendoza had one hit each.

Mendoza batted in three runs for the Bravettes.

Byrd started on the mound for Union County and pitched four and a third innings. She allowed 12 hits and recorded one strikeout. Daylee Shelton pitched in relief, giving up two hits and walking two batters.

Union County goes on the road to Owensboro Catholic on Thursday. The regular season finale will be played on Friday when Madisonville-North Hopkins visits UCHS.

Union County took a 6-9 season record into a game on Monday at Caldwell County.

## UC Softball Splits Games In Illinois

The Union County Bravettes crossed the Ohio River into Illinois on Saturday for softball games against Harrisburg and Hardin County. The Bravettes split those games.

In the first contest of the day, Union County lost to Harrisburg, 12-6. The Bravettes bounced back in the second game of the day with a 17-0 win over Hardin County.

## Union County – 6 Harrisburg – 12

In the game against Harrisburg, Union County held a short-lived lead in the top of the second inning before the Lady Bulldogs tool control and claimed the 12-6 win.

Harrisburg scored the game's first run with a single tally in the bottom of the first inning.

Union County answered with two runs in the top of the second. Karley Byrd was safe on an error and advanced to second on a sacrifice bunt by Miley Mendoza. After two outs, Ella Arnett singled to send Byrd and Mendoza to second base and third base. A single off the bat of Audrey Staley plated Byrd, and Mendoza scored on a wild pitch to give Union County a 2-1 lead.

Harrisburg regained the lead in the bottom of the second, scoring four runs to open a 5-2 cushion.

Union County had a single run in the top of the third inning when Hargrove and Daylee Shelton lashed consecutive doubles that trimmed the Lady Bulldogs lead to 5-3.

Harrisburg scored three more runs in the bottom of the fourth inning to open an 8-3 lead.

Hargrove reached base with a one out single in the top of the fifth inning. Two batters later, Byrd blasted a home run over the centerfield fence to cut the Harrisburg lead to 8-5.

The Lady Bulldogs plated two more runs in the fifth inning to open a 10-5 lead.

Harrisburg scored their final runs in the sixth inning when two runners

crossed the plate to give the Lady Bulldogs a 12-5 lead.

Union County's last run was scored in the seventh when Miley Mosley and Hargrove singled. Mosley scored on a Harrisburg error for the 12-6 final score.

Union County had 10 hits in the game. The Bravettes committed five errors on defense.

Hargrove paced the Bravettes offense with three hits. Staley and Arnett had two safeties, and Mosley, Shelton, and Byrd had one hit each.

Byrd was credited with three runs batted in. Staley and Shelton batted in one run each.

Mosley and Byrd handled the pitching duties for Union County. The each pitched three innings, allowing 13 hits, walking one batter, and recording three strikeouts. Mosley was the losing pitcher.

## Union County – 17 Hardin County – 0

In the second game on Saturday, and Bravettes banged out 14 hits enroute to a 17-0 win over Hardin County.

Union County scored four runs in each of the first two innings, added five runs in the fourth inning, and scored four more times in the fifth inning. The game was stopped after five innings.

The Union County defense committed two errors.

Mosley, Byrd, Shelton, Mendoza, and Brylee Jackson had two hits each for Union County. Hargrove, Arnett, Jerah Johnson, and Ellie Hancock collected one hit apiece.

Byrd, Arnett, and Jackson batted in three runs each. Shelton and Mendoza had two RBI apiece, and Hargrove and Hancock had one RBI each.

Shelton was on the mound for the Bravettes. She allowed two hits, walked two batters, and recorded four strikeouts.

The Bravettes improved their season record to 7-10.
