Focus Substances: Nicotine/Tobacco & THC

Project Details:



Youth Prevention Ambassadors and adult advisors visited all locations in Monroe County that sold tobacco products. While in the stores, youth noted locations of nicotine products in relation to candy and other items marketed toward kids. They also noted the stores’ signage- how many signs were present on the front of the building, advertisements at children’s eye level, and advertisements for menthol products. The Ambassadors also looked for We Card signage at the door and checkout counter.

Project Goals:

- 1) Reduce retail access of tobacco/nicotine and THC products to persons under 21.
- 2) Increase awareness of the harms of youth tobacco/nicotine and THC use.
- 3) Effectively communicate retail survey findings to key decision-makers and community members to support policy changes and prevention efforts
