PROPOSED TAX NOTIFICATION
MONROE COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION

Real Property and Personal Property Tax Rate

The Monroe County Board of Education is proposing a general fund tax levy of 48.7 cents plus .10 cents for exonerations on real property and 48.7 cents plus .10 cents on personal property.

The General Fund tax levied in fiscal year 2026 was 49.6 cents on real property and 51.4 cents on personal property and produced revenue of \$4,524,962.96. A portion of the revenue in Fiscal Year 2026 was for 2024 franchise collections.

The proposed General Fund tax rate of 48.8 cents on real property and 48.8 cents on personal property is expected to produce less revenue \$4,450,120.70. (calculation includes .10 for exoneration). Of this amount \$1,116,777.53 is from new property and personal property. The proposed tax rate will produce less revenue than received in FY2026 due an old collection.

This information is published pursuant to KRS 160.470. The proposed tax rate is not subject to recall under KRS 132.017.

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED by The City of Gamaliel, Monroe County, Kentucky, as follows:

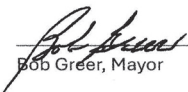
SECTION ONE: WHEREAS the property assessment for property within the City of Gamaliel, Kentucky, has been certified as follows:

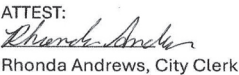
Real Property \$13,699,544

SECTION TWO: There is levied for the year 2026 an ad valorem tax of ~~three hundred thousandths'~~ eight cents (0.308) per one hundred dollars (\$100) assessed valuation of all taxable property within the jurisdiction, and an Ad valorem tax of ~~three hundred thousandths'~~ eight cents (0.308) per one hundred Dollars (\$100) assessed valuation taxable tangible personal property within the jurisdiction.

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED by The City of Gamaliel, Monroe County, Kentucky, as follows:

SECTION ONE: WHEREAS the property assessment for property within the City of Gamaliel, Kentucky, has been certified as follows:

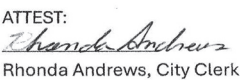
Automobile Property \$2,601,077

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The Monroe County Conservation District is proud to provide financial and technical assistance to the landowners of Monroe County since 1945. The Monroe County Conservation District was organized to plan and carry out a program of soil and water conservation on all land within the county. The Monroe County Conservation District receives financial assistance from the Kentucky Division of Conservation and the Monroe County Fiscal Court and is presently operating within its budget. The Monroe County Conservation District is a member in good standing with both the Kentucky and National Association of Conservation Districts. The Conservation District has representation at the State and National meetings. The county-wide conservation program is administered by seven supervisors at meetings held once a month. The meetings are held the 2nd Wednesday of each month at 1:00 p.m. at our office on 201 W. Paige St. Tompkinsville, Ky. and are open to the public.

The Monroe County Conservation District aids producers in making application for state cost share funding and federal program funding for various projects. State Cost Share and EQIP are continuous signups throughout the year. These programs address your conservation resource concerns and allow funding assistance thru one or more of the programs. Feel free to call our office at 270/487-6528 ext. 3 for any of your conservation questions or needs. Our staff is available to assist you with conservation needs and aid in signup for funding on available programs.

The Monroe County Conservation District and NRCS District Conservationist Adam McLerran are available to assist our Monroe County producers with technical and financial assistance through various programs. The local NRCS and Monroe County Conservation District work together in getting approval for Environmental Quality Incentives Program in Monroe County. NRCS and the Conservation District along with Kentucky Dept. of Fish and Wildlife, Kentucky Division of Forestry and the Farm Service Agency work together to provide technical assistance through the following programs: Environmental Quality Incentive Program, Conservation Stewardship Program, Conservation Reserve Program, Grassland Reserve Program and Wetland Reserve Programs along with other state and federal programs. Feel free to call our office to see what programs are available to address your environmental concerns.

The Monroe County Conservation District will be making application for CAIP in the upcoming months with signups to start in the fall. This program enables a wide variety of practices on a cost share basis. These practices include Hay Storage, Fencing, Water Tanks, Handling Facilities, Pasture Renovation, Cattle Genetics and Technology. The total funds are divided between all producers that signup for the program. Since CAIP started in 2001, Monroe County has received over \$5 million dollars to provide financial assistance to producers. Be sure to watch for the CAIP program signup through information that is advertised on the Monroe County Conservation District Ky, Facebook page, the local newspaper and electronic billboards in the area.

The Monroe County Conservation District sponsored a \$2,500.00 scholarship to a graduating senior that plans to attend college with the emphasis toward conservation. The 2025 winner was Klaire McPherson. We wish Klaire the best in furthering her education. The Conservation District promotes the Jim Claypool art and writing contest. Monroe County High School student Maggie Miller was the 1st place writing winner for Monroe County. TES student Ember Ethridge was the 2025 1st place Art winner recipient. Ember was also recognized as the 2nd place state winner. Ember along with her parents attended the awards reception at the Kentucky Castle in Versailles. We encourage all students to participate and congratulate them both. The Jim Claypool 2026 Tabloids will be delivered to the school in September. The theme will be Ground Rules: The story beneath your feet

The Conservation District continues to provide landowners with rental equipment such as no-till drills at \$10 an acre and sprayers for \$30 a day. The Conservation District also carries filter fabric available for sale used in different programs. The Monroe County Conservation District is continuing to reimburse \$45 for the removal of fallen animals, upon bringing a receipt into the office.

PROPOSED TAX NOTIFICATION PUBLIC HEARING
MONROE COUNTY AMBULANCE BOARD

The Monroe County Ambulance Board will hold a public hearing on September 11, 2026 at 8:00 am at the Monroe County Medical Center Education Room for the purpose of obtaining comments from the public regarding the proposed tax rate.

The tax rate levied for 2025 was 7.30 and produced revenues in the amount of \$462,276. This year's compensating rate is 7.20 and will produce revenues in the amount of \$491,805. The Monroe County Ambulance Board proposes a tax rate of 7.40 which will produce a total of \$505,466 in revenues.

Revenue expected from New Property is \$9,728; revenue expected from Personal Property is \$194,955; revenue expected from Motor Vehicle is \$100,061; and revenue expected from Watercraft is \$1,780.

Revenue received in excess of last year's revenue will be used for expenses to operate the ambulance service and to offset the deficit of expenses exceeding expected revenues.

The Kentucky General Assembly requires that the Monroe County Ambulance Board publishes this notice with the above information contained herein.
