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Royer Miss Madison posts successful test in Celina

CELINA, Ohio — The Miss Madison Racing Team headed to Celina last Saturday and found out everything they wanted to know, putting the U-6 Royer Miss Madison through a successful test during the Governor's Cup Regatta on Grand Lake St. Mary's.

Driver Brandon Kennedy was able to put the Miss Madison through its paces, posting six hot laps on the tiny 1-mile course, posting a top speed of 149.68 mph. After a morning attempt in which the boat was unable to get up on plane, the afternoon test was exactly what the team had hoped for.

"I think the goal was just make sure no leaks, make sure everything's good, steering is good, skid fin's good, all that good stuff. So we got our things accomplished," Kennedy said of the test. "The boat actually ran faster than I thought it would on this course. Feeling-wise, it got loose. So I'm real excited now that the changes will pay dividends down there in Madison. I'm so excited about that."

Crew chief Trey Holt and the team spent the offseason making modifications to the nearly 30-year-old boat and were excited to see how all of that played out. But too much weight in the front end halted the team's first test session when Kennedy was

unable to get the boat up on plane.

Back on the trailer, Holt and the crew set about making the changes needed to correct the balance issue and the second test went so successfully that the team decided to pack up and not attempt a third.

"We changed the skid fin, changed the wing angle, and moved some weight around, and it looked like it helped a bunch," Holt said. "This was the first time here at Celina and it was great. We all had a great time, had fun, didn't hurt anything, and that's main thing. And the boat looks good, so pack it up and take it home and go through it at the shop."

This year marks the first time since 2007 that an H1 boat has tested on Grand Lake St. Mary's. That year, future Miss Madison driver Jimmy Shane tested both boats owned at the time by the Formulaboats.com team on the lake in anticipation for the 2007 season.

The H1 Unlimited circuit hosts a preseason test session on the Columbia River at Tri-Cities, Washington, each June but Miss Madison Racing was unable to attend. Instead, the change to test at Celina presented itself and the team seized the opportunity.

Kennedy, who has raced on Grand Lake St. Mary's several times in smaller
