Trimble County, the family owns and operates eight McDonald's Franchises in Kentucky and Indiana out of its headquarters in La Grange.

TRIMBLE COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION

The Trimble County Board of Education is proposing a general fund tax levy of **75.4 cents** on real property and 75.4 cents on personal property.

The General Fund tax levied in fiscal year 2026 was 76 cents on real property and 76 cents on personal property and produced revenue of \$5,475,883. The proposed General Fund tax rate of 75.4 cents on real property and 75.4 cents on personal property is expected to produce \$5,931,577. Of this amount, \$945,600 is from new and personal property.

The compensating tax for 2027 is 72.6 cents on real property and 72.6 cents on personal property and is expected to produce \$5,711,307.

The proposed rate is expected to generate more revenue than received in the preceding year. The general areas to which revenue of \$455,694 above 2026 revenue is to be allocated are as follows:

- **Cost of collections: \$15,949**
- **Instruction: \$243,796**
- **Transportation: \$102,075**
- **Maintenance of plant: \$93,873**
