**COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY
TRIMBLE COUNTY FISCAL COURT
ORDINANCE NO.
AMENDING ORDINANCE AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO
ROAD ORDINANCE NO. 620.11 TEMPORARY AMENDMENT**

WHEREAS, the Trimble County Fiscal Court has realized the need to temporarily amend Trimble County ordinance 620.11; and

WHEREAS, the Trimble County Fiscal Court deems this need to be in the best interest of safety for emergency personnel and common traffic in subdivisions;

WHEREAS, the Trimble County Fiscal Court has realized that subdivisions were developed and tracts were sold under the assumption that the road easements would be maintained by government entities;

WHEREAS, the Trimble County Fiscal Court has determined the property value in such subdivisions are lower and depleted due to such assumptions; and

WHEREAS, the Trimble County Fiscal Court has determined the opportunity is necessary for such subdivision road easement to meet certain specifications to be added to the Trimble County road maintenance system.

NOW THEREFORE, it be ordained by the Fiscal Court of Trimble County in the Commonwealth of Kentucky as follows:

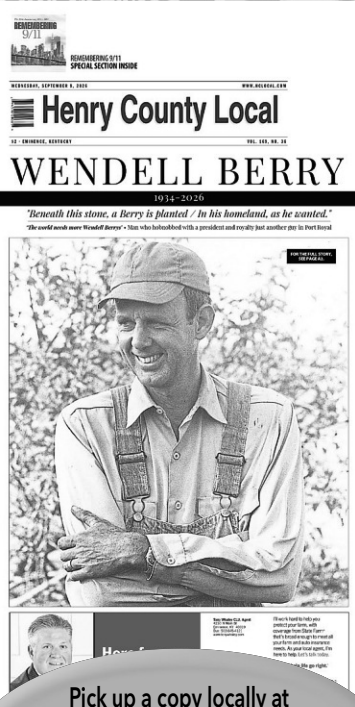
- 1) A Subdivision is defined in Trimble County Ordinance 930.4;
- 2) The subdivision must be registered as a Trimble County Fiscal Court approved plat and recorded in the Trimble County Clerk's office;
- 3) The Subdivision plat, to be qualified, must have been approved by the Trimble County Fiscal Court or tracts sold between September 19th,1994 and April 20th,2015;
- 4.) Subdivisions that qualify must have a livable permanent residence on located on the premises at the time of this Ordinance being passed. Livable means people are currently living inside the permanent residence, no barns, storage buildings, shed etc. only residents.
- 5) The landowner(s) who own property in such subdivisions, at their sole cost for easement, deed, materials, survey costs, and clerical work, who and wish to qualify for this amendment, must release the road easement to the Trimble County Fiscal Court;
- 6) The landowner(s) of such subdivision who wish to qualify for this amendment must obtain at least fifty-one percent (51%) of landowners of the subdivision, by signing a petition to be presented to the County Judge Executive;
- 7) The landowner(s) of such subdivisions who wish to qualify for this amendment must decide on one spokesperson to manage the request with the Magistrate of the District, the Trimble County Judge Executive, and the Trimble County Road Supervisor;
- 8) The spokesperson shall meet onsite with the Trimble County Judge Executive, the Magistrate of the District and the Trimble County Road Supervisor to determine a course of action and an estimated cost of material and labor;
- 9) The landowner(s) may hire their own contractor to comply with the speculations agreed upon and paid by the landowner(s);
- 10) The specifications required for the road easement to be adopted onto the Trimble County Road Maintenance system shall be analyzed on site by the spokesperson, the Magistrate of the District, The Trimble County Judge Executive and the Trimble County Road Supervisor;
- 11) If deemed acceptable all deed and clerical work shall be approved by the Trimble County Attorney, with the road easement approval by the Trimble County Fiscal Court in order to be adopted onto the Trimble County Road Maintenance system;
- 12) This Temporary amendment to Trimble County Ordinance 620.11 shall be in effect for one (1) year from the date of the 2nd reading of this amendment by the Trimble County Fiscal Court;
- 13) Any sub-divisions developed after April 20th, 2015, shall not qualify for this amendment and those sub-divisions shall continue to abide by Ordinance 620.11;
- 14.) Campgrounds, RV parks, hunting property with primitive camping and vacant land does not qualify under this Amendment; and
- 15) If any new county road created based upon this temporary amendment and thereafter, the party responsible for the damage to the road shall pay the costs of the repairs to said road.
- 16) This initial ordinance became in effective on the 4th day of August, 2025, upon its passage and advertisement according to law.
- 17) This amendment amends, retroactively from August 4, 2026, the Ordinance to continue to be in effect for one (1) additional year from the second reading of this amendment by the Trimble County Fiscal Court.

The first reading of this Ordinance was made and approved by a majority vote at a meeting of the Trimble County Fiscal Court on August 17, 2026.

The second reading of this Ordinance was made at a meeting of the Trimble County Fiscal Court on September 8th, 2026, and upon motion by Magistrate Crustal Whitice and seconded by Magistrate Chris Liler, the same was called for a vote and approved by a majority vote of the Trimble County Fiscal Court.
