These notices shall satisfy two separate but related procedural requirements for the activities to be undertaken by the *City of Campton*.

TO ALL INTERESTED AGENCIES, GROUPS, AND PERSONS:

Request for Release of Funds

On or about **April 4, 2026**, the *City of Campton* will submit a request to the Department for Local Government for the release of ARC funds under Title 1 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (PL 93-383) to undertake the following project:

The City of Campton, Campton Sewer Rehabilitation Project
(Project Title or Name)

The City of Campton has addressed rehabilitation of its sanitary sewers in unimproved fields and yards. This project will rehabilitate sanitary sewers beneath paved streets, parking lots, etc. It is anticipated that the work will largely be cured in place pipe lining (CIPP) to preclude disturbance of improved surfaces.

The work includes 9,953 LF of 6 mm CIPP for 8-inch pipe, including post-work CCTV, bypass pumping, site clearing, traffic control, root treatment, etc. It also includes 16 each main line spot repair, 9,953 LF sewer pipe cleaning and CCTV, 95 each service lateral repair, 68 manhole rehabilitation, plant influent pump station improvements, and treatment plant controls - new PLC based AeroMod Control System.

One of the goals of the project is to reduce I&I by lining 9,953 feet of existing sewer pipes using CIPP. The project will replace the pumps and controls in two lift stations, one of which is the plant influent lift station. It will also replace controls in the WWTP. The project also includes rehab of 68 manholes.

Finding of No Significant Impact

The *City of Campton* has determined that the project will have no significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) (PL-91190) is not required. An Environmental Review Record (ERR) respecting the project has been made by the *City of Campton* which documents the environmental review of the project and more fully sets forth the reasons why such a Statement is not required. This Environmental Review Record is available upon request, at the **City of Campton, 698 Main St. P.O. Box 35, Campton, KY 41301 between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M.** No further environmental review of such project is proposed to be conducted.

Public Comments

All interested agencies, groups, and persons disagreeing with the ERR decision are invited to submit written comments for consideration to the *City of Campton*. Such written comments should be received at **698 Main St. P.O. Box 35, Campton, KY 41301, or michael.smith@kradd.org** on or before **April 4, 2026**. All comments received will be considered before authorizing the submission of a request for a release of funds or taking any administrative action on the project before the date specified in the preceding sentence. Comments should specify which Notice they are addressing.

Environmental Certification

The *City of Campton* will undertake the project described above with ARC funds from the Department for Local Government under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. **The City of Campton** is certifying to the state that the City of Campton and **Kathi May**, in their official capacity as **Mayor**, consent to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities concerning environmental reviews, decision-making, and action; and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. The legal effect of the certification is that upon its approval, the *City of Campton* may use the ARC funds, and the state and ARC will have satisfied their responsibilities under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 and related laws and authorities.

Objection to Release of Funds

The state will accept objections to its release of funds and the **City of Campton certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission dates or its actual receipt for the request (whichever is the later)** only if they are on one of the following bases:

- The certification was not executed by the **City of Campton** Certifying Officer.
- The **City of Campton** has failed to make one of the two findings according to SS58.41 or to make the written determination decision required by SS578.57, 58.53, or 58.64 for the project, as applicable.
- The **City of Campton** has omitted one or more of the steps outlined in Subparts F and G for the preparation and completion of an EA.
- No opportunity was given to the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation or its Executive Director to review the effect of the project on a property listed on the National Register of Historic Places or found to be eligible for such listing by the Secretary of the Interior, per 36 CFR Part 800.

Objection to Release of Funds

The state will accept objections to its release of funds and the **City of Campton certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission dates or its actual receipt for the request (whichever is the later)** only if they are on one of the following bases:

- The certification was not executed by the **City of Campton** Certifying Officer.

- No opportunity was given to the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation or its Executive Director to review the effect of the project on a property listed on the National Register of Historic Places or found to be eligible for such listing by the Secretary of the Interior, per 36 CFR Part 800.
- The recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs, or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR part 58 before approval of the release of funds and approval of the Environmental Certification by ARC or the State.
- Another Federal agency acting according to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality.

Objections must be prepared and submitted following the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed to the Department for Local Government, Office of Federal Grants, 1024 Capital Center Drive, Ste. 340 Frankfort, Kentucky 40601.

Objections to the release of funds on bases other than those stated above will not be considered by the state. No objection received after **April 19, 2026**, will be considered by the state. Potential objectors should contact the Department for Local Government to verify the actual last day of the state Comment period.
