

Child Find for Children with Disabilities in Need of Special Education or 504 Services

CHILD FIND

Educational Records The Wolfe County School District keeps educational records in a secure location in each school and Board office.

The Wolfe County School District obtains written consent from a parent or eligible student (age 18 or who is attending a postsecondary institution), before disclosing personally identifiable information to an entity or individual not authorized to receive it under FERPA.

For students who have been determined eligible for Special Education, educational records will be destroyed at the request of the parents when they are no longer needed to provide educational programs or services. The Wolfe County School District may destroy the educational records of a child without parent request (5) Five years after they are no longer needed to provide educational programs or services. Parents are advised that data contained in the records may later be needed for Social Security benefits or other purposes. The Wolfe County School District may retain, for an indefinite period of time, a record of the student's name, address, telephone number, grades, attendance records, classes attended, grade level completed, and year completed.

Eligibility Children eligible for Special Education include those children with disabilities who have autism, deaf-blindness, developmental delay, emotional-behavior disability, hearing impairment, mental disability, multiple disabilities, orthopedic impairment, other health impairment, specific learning disability, speech or language impairment, traumatic brain injury, or visual impairment and who because of such an impairment need Special Education services.

Children eligible for 504 services include those children in a public elementary and secondary education program who have a current physical or mental impairment that currently substantially limits some major life activity which causes the student's ability to access the school environment or school activities to be substantially limited.

Children eligible for the State-Funded Preschool program include three-and four-year old children identified with disabilities and four-year-old children who are at-risk, as defined by federal poverty levels up to 150%. Preschool children eligible for special education must have an Individual Education Plan (IEP) instead of a 504 plan to receive State-Funded Preschool program services.

The Wolfe County School District has an ongoing "Child Find" system, which is designed to locate, identify and evaluate any child residing in a home, facility, or residence within its geographical boundaries, age three (3) to twenty-one (21) years, who may have a disability and be in need of Special Education or 504 services. This includes children who are not in school; those who are in public, private, or home school; those who are highly mobile such as children who are migrant or homeless; and those who are advancing from grade to grade, who may need but are not receiving Special Education or 504 services.

The district's "Child Find" system includes children with disabilities attending private or home schools within the school district boundaries who may need special education services.

The Wolfe County School District will make sure any child enrolled in its district who qualifies for Special Education or 504 services, regardless of how severe the disability, is provided appropriate Special Education or 504 services at no cost to the parents of the child.

Parents, relatives, public and private agency employees, and concerned citizens are urged to help the Wolfe County School District find any child who may have a disability and need Special Education or 504 services. The District needs to know the name and age, or date of birth of the child; the name, address, and phone number(s) of the parents or guardian; the possible disability; and other information to determine if Special Education or 504 services are needed.

Letters and phone calls are some of the ways the Wolfe County School District collects the information needed. The information the school District collects will be used to contact the parents of the child and find out if the child needs to be evaluated or referred for Special Education or 504 services.

As part of these efforts the Wolfe County School District will use screening information, student records, and basic assessment information it collects on all children in the District to help locate those children who have a disability and need Special Education or 504 services. Any information the District collects through "Child Find" is maintained confidentially.

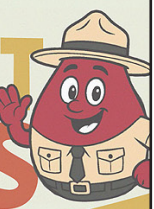
The District office is open Monday through Friday, from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Local Firemen Hone Their Skills Fire Alarms Suppression Systems Subject of Training Session

On June 18, State Fire Training was held at the Wolfe County Fire Department. Instruction centered on fire protection systems including automatic sprinkler and or standpipe systems found in residential and commercial structures. Participants were taught that when these systems are present they should utilize the system to control the fire.

Automatic sprinkler systems are designed to increase the survivability of occupants and firefighters during a structural

fire. Most fire sprinkler systems are designed with control mode sprinklers. These sprinklers are only intended to control fire growth and prevent flashover. Firefighters learned that they need to enter and complete suppression of the fire before turning off the system. Therefore, activated systems should not be discontinued before the fire is under control and an IC (Incident Command) gives a shutdown order.

In the pictures below is the trailer they use to teach

firefighters what to do in real situations when they need those skills.
