Data center ordinance is talked at meet

The Wolfe County Fiscal Court met in regular session Tuesday, Sept 8, to address a mix of ongoing legislative matters and new administrative business. Led by County Judge Executive Raymond Banks, alongside Magistrates Arthur Vest, Gene Booth and Billy Banks addressed five items on the agenda.

Following the call to order and approval of the previous meeting's minutes, the court turned its attention to old business. A key legislative focus was the second reading of the Data Center Ordinance, a measure that could shape future technological infrastructure and

City Council in busy session; lake cleanup set

The Campton City Commission met Sept. 1 at City Hall to deliberate on a packed agenda, which was dominated by a discussion of local infrastructure progress, economic development updates, and other pressing civic matters affecting Wolfe County residents. Also discussed was the Wolfe Lake Cleanup, which is scheduled this Saturday.

Mayor Kathi May presided over the session, which brought together local leaders, utility staff, and community members to address both short-term water service disruptions and long-term project planning.

The session opened with approval of previous meeting minutes on a motion by Commissioner Lisa Terrill seconded by Commissioner Chris Campbell.

Mayor May asked for comments from the public. Brenton Turner a National Guard member, addressed the commission regarding water access. Turner stated his current water well does not provide an adequate supply of water for a family
