Blue Licks Battlefield State Park commemorates 244th anniversary of Battle of Blue Licks

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The 244th Anniversary of the Battle of Blue Licks was held this past weekend at Blue Licks Battlefield State Resort Park, with a plethora of special events scheduled throughout the park over the weekend, beginning on Friday, Aug. 14, 2026, through Sunday, Aug. 16, 2026.

The very memorable Battle of Blue Licks reenactment, followed by the running of the Gauntlet, was held on Saturday, Aug. 15, 2026, beginning at 5:00pm.

“The Battle of Blue Licks, fought on August 19, 1782, 244 years ago, was the last major battle of the American Revolutionary War in Kentucky and a decisive defeat for the Kentucky militia. The Battle remains a significant historical event, symbolizing both the resilience and the vulnerability of early Kentucky settlers during the Revolutionary War.”

The Nicholas County Board of Education is proposing a general fund tax levy of 42.7 cents on real property and 43.9 cents on personal property, this includes 0.2 for exonerations.

The General Fund tax levied in fiscal year 2026 was 43.1 cents on real property and 43.7 cents on personal property and produced revenue of \$1,585,317.89. The proposed General Fund tax rate of 42.7 cents on real property and 43.9 cents on personal property is expected to produce \$1,646,541.76. Of this amount, \$236,809.09 is from new and personal property. The compensating tax for 2027 is 42.5 cents on real property and 43.7 cents on personal property and is expected to produce \$1,638,853.66, not including the 0.2 for exonerations.

The proposed rate is expected to generate more revenue than received in the preceding year. The general areas to which revenue of \$61,223.87 above 2026 revenue is to be allocated are as follows: Cost of collections, \$2,448.96; instruction, \$58,774.91.

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Robertson County Board of Education Proposed Tax Notification

The Robertson County Board of Education is proposing a general fund tax levy of 75.7 cents on real property and 75.7 cents on personal property. The General Fund tax levied in fiscal year 2026 was 73.5 cents on real property and 73.5 cents on personal property and produced revenue of \$947,692.92. The proposed General Fund tax rate of 75.7 cents on real property and 75.7 cents on personal property is expected to produce \$923,214.58. Of this amount, \$145,556.60 is from new and personal property. The compensating tax for 2027 is 72.8 cents on real property and 73.5 cents on personal property and is expected to produce \$889,122.66.

The proposed rate is not expected to generate more revenue than received in the preceding year.
