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ORDINANCE NO. __26-07__

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING OFFICIAL HOLIDAYS FOR THE CITY OF ALLEN, KENTUCKY, AND PROVIDING FOR THE OBSERVANCE THEREOF

WHEREAS, the City of Allen desires to establish official holidays for City offices and employees;

WHEREAS, Kentucky law recognizes certain public holidays on which public offices of the Commonwealth may be closed; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission finds it in the best interest of the City to identify the holidays to be observed by the City of Allen and to provide procedures for holiday observance, staffing, and compensation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ALLEN, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Official Holidays

The following days shall be observed as official holidays for the City of Allen:

1. New Year’s Eve – December 31, New Year’s Day – January 1, Memorial Day – Last Monday in May, Juneteenth – June 19, Veterans Day – November 11, Independence Day – July 4, Labor Day – First Monday in September, Thanksgiving Day – Fourth Thursday in November, Day after Thanksgiving – Friday following Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Eve – December 24, Christmas Day – December 25

Section 2. Observance and City Operations

If a holiday falls on a Saturday, it may be observed on the preceding Friday; if it falls on a Sunday, it may be observed on the following Monday. City offices shall be closed on official holidays, except as needed for public safety, emergency response, utilities, sanitation, maintenance, or other essential services

Section 3. Employee Holiday Leave

Eligible City employees shall receive holiday leave or compensation in accordance with the City’s personnel policies, budgetary ordinances, and applicable law. Employees may be required to work on a holiday when necessary to provide essential City service.

Section 4. Repealer and Severability

All ordinances or policies in conflict with this Ordinance are repealed to the extent of the conflict. If any part of this Ordinance is held invalid, the remaining provisions shall continue in full force and effect.

Section 5. Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage, approval, and publication as required by law.
